the property at price and terms agreed upon. With that assurance the buyer can, usually, without very much investment, have time to determine if the property can be used for its proposed uses and if the required amount of land can be assembled; or as sometimes is the case in long term options, the buyer can speculate that by expiry date the property will be worth more than it is optioned for, and by exercising it, can have property below market value.

An option is voluntary on both parties and cannot be imposed on anyone, even by authorities that have the power of expropriation.

Therefore, on the part of the buyer, the commitment is only as firm as the deposit, and by losing it, can opt out.
