* Agriculture Minister Eugene Whelan urged farmers at the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture annual banquet "to see the wisdom" in forming national marketing agencies.

* Hagersville council discussed the building of a new fire hall, costing \$200 million.

* The Jarvis Lions presented their 20th annual minstrel show.

* The energy board hearing into Union Gas' request to discontinue service to 235 customers in Haldimand County resumed in Cayuga. Corrosion experts condemned most of the lines serving these people.

* The firing of Hagersville Secondary School art teacher Bruce Tunney triggered a demonstration in the gym involving about 200 students.

* The Hagersville Flyers edged St. George 4 - 3 to capture the Junior "D" Championship.

* Stelco outlined a landscaping plan to their Nanticoke site at a public meeting in Port Dover. They also indicated they might start construction in 1974.

* Hagersville's first proposed Loitering By-law which would stop persons hanging about village streets, sitting on the hoods of cars, smoking in ditches and idling, was given its first reading.

* Patsy Druyff of Jarvis was crowned Hagersville Secondary school queen.

* Andrew Cherkas, a Toronto realtor announced an "unknown" part was interested in optioning 5,000-10,000 acres of farmland in the Jarvis area.

* Terry Lynn Fallis, a Jarvis area girl, won the Miss Cayuga Speedway title.

* Charles Duncan, a former Cayuga policeman, celebrated his 100th birthday at the W.H.G.H.

(continued from page 1) towns and villages would be required to walk to school in semi-darkness.

Also at the meeting, The Board awarded a new contract to Culp Construction Limited in the amount of \$84,212, to re-cap the present roof at Hagersville Secondary School.

The property committee of the Board is investigating installation of burglar alarm systems in various schools within the County.

The elementary school enrollment in Haldimand schools has increased from 5,084 in September to 5,098 in November. The secondary enrollment has declined from 2,974 in September to 2,861.

It was noted that this secondary school decline is more rapid than in 1972.

The Ontario Health Insurance Plan will cover \$1.00 of the \$1.50 increase in nursing home rates, and the eligible resident over 16 years of age will be responsible for the additional 50¢ per day. For children under 16 years of age, OHIP pays the entire \$15.00 per day rate.

In addition, semi-private accommodation rates may increase up to 25¢ per day for an allowable maximum limit of \$3.50 per day. Private accommodation increases are permitted up to 50¢ per day making the maximum allowable limit \$7.00 from the present \$6.50 per day.

Mr. McCombs and the mayors of the six lower-tier municipalities are also preparing a list of specifications for the position of chief administration officer for the region.

"Local qualified people will be given first consideration," he said.
