Shoreline Property Assistance Rules

Shoreline property owners who are plagued with erosion problems may apply for Shoreline Property Assistance.

Necessary steps and rules, which must be taken and followed by the applicant are: (1) An application filed with the Clerk of the Township. (2) A minimal deposit of \$100 payable to the Township should the Engineer forsee a larger fee being necessary, a further sum would be required.

(3) Any part of the deposit would be applied to the Engineer's fee, who will inspect the property on behalf of the applicant and the Provincial Department handling Erosion applications.

(4) In the event of the application being accepted by the Department after processing the Engineer's Report, the deposit would be returned to the applicant. Should the Engineer's Report be not accepted by the Department, the Engineer's fee would be deducted from the deposit and balance if any, returned to the applicant.

(5) Should the application be accepted a repayment loan would be arranged through the Department.

(6) SECURITY: - On non - payment, the loan would be applied against the property, and collected under Land Tax Sales section of the "Assessment Act."
