Flyers And Corvairs Play 6-6 Tie

The Hagersville Flyers hosted the Caledonia Corvairs in an exhibition game on the day after New Year's and it was probably the most exciting game played at the arena this year.

The biggest crowd of the season was on hand to watch, and you could feel the excitement when you walked in the door. It was just a case of the old rivalry springing up between Caledonia and Hagersville and in sports there is nothing to match it lately. Caledonia is playing in the O.H.A. Jr. 'B' series while the Flyers are in second place in the Jr. 'D' league.

By all reports the score should have been about 8-1 for the Corvairs and this writer thought the boys had bitten off more than they could chew. But hustle and pride can not be replaced and the Flyers had plenty of both going for them in this game.

Terry Fryett who played his best game as a Flyer scored the first goal for Hagersville before every one got seated and this gave the home team the confidence they needed to make a game out of it. With three and a half minutes gone in the game, Paul Phibbs broke up the ice and went around Wayne Smith on defence. He slid the puck over to Tony Yacobino and when it looked like Tony went too far, the puck went in behind the Corvair goalie for a 2-0 lead.

St. George Defeats Flyers

The St. George Lions came from behind a 3-1 first period score to drop the Hagersville Flyers 5-4 in a well played game in Hagersville Sunday night.

The win for the Lions almost locks up first place for the team as they now hold a 12 point bulge over the Flyers. The Flyers do not play the Lions any more this year so it would take a miracle or a total collapse by St. George for the Flyers to finish first.

Ross McKeen caught Greg Ross with his head down and handed out the most solid body check of the night. Ross was a little slow getting up but

the Corvairs were skating with their heads up after this. Bill Winkworth just stepped back on the ice from a penalty when Glen Hewson and Yacobino broke up the ice.

They got the puck to Winkworth who let go his big shot that Wayne Sochasky got a glove on but couldn't hold. It trickled into the net for a 3-1 Hagersville lead after the first period. Caledonia held a 18-8 edge in shots on goal.

The Flyers came out in the second period and looked like they were going to sit on their 3-1 lead. This was the only mistake the team made all night. When they were taking the play to the Corvairs they were holding their own but when they eased up the Corvairs came on like gang busters. Tim Sutcliffe made it 3-2 with Pat Martin and Don Peart getting assists.

Peart then tied the game at 3-3 when Jean Drouin found him in the open. Twenty seconds later Drouin made it 4-3 and it looked like the Flyers were finished.

It took the Flyers nearly half of the third period to get the next goal to make it a 4-4 game. Hewson took a pass from Fryett and put a real move on Dick Tweedle who had come in for the last half of the game. With Winkworth in the penalty box Sutcliffe got the 5th goal for Caledonia to make it 5-4. Rick Anderson then made an end to end rush and while every one stood around watching him he flipped the puck past Brown for what looked like the winning goal.

Terry Fryett took a face off in the visitors end and fed it back to Dave Long who let a

sizzling shot go that found the top corner past Tweedle. With five minutes left Don Brown fed the puck to Phibbs who in turn got it to Yacobino who tied the game at 6-6.

Caledonia Coach Ches Martindale looked a little disappointed at this point, and it was the first time we had seen the Hagersville mentor show any emotion in two years behind the bench. Ken Morrison actually shouted at Terry in the last two minutes and if he told him to make sure he won the face offs Terry did his job well. Twice the Corvairs had a chance to score with the face off in the

Hagersville end but both times Fryett won the draw and the boys cleared the puck out of danger.

Kirk Brown was the outstanding player on the ice, making the type of plays he made in the playoffs last spring. He kept the team in the game and was the one man responsible for the tie.

Fryett and Ross McKeen also turned in great games for the Flyers while Sutcliffe, Peart, Pat Martin and Wayne Smith were the best for the Corvairs. It would be nice to see a rematch of this type of action. Managers Bruce Cambell and Bud Miller take note.

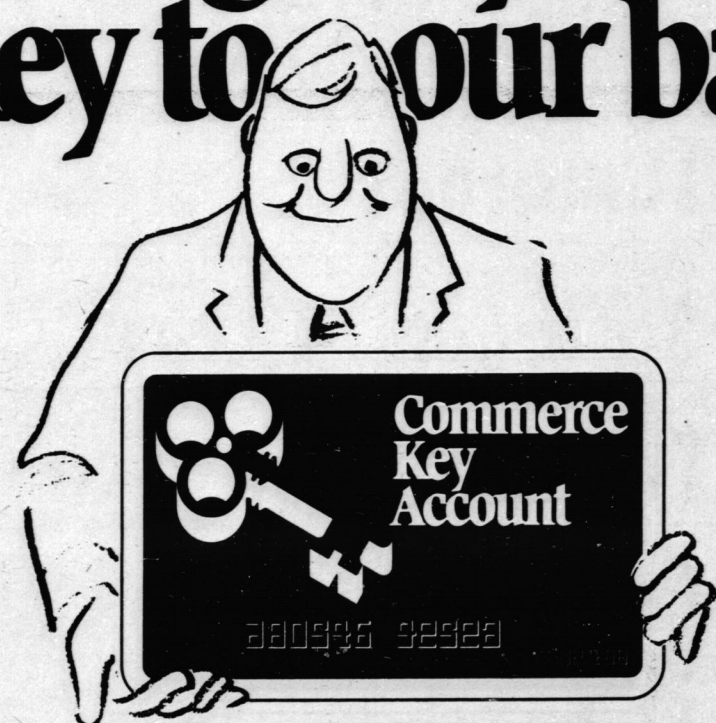
