The following is a brief report of the June meeting of the Selkirk Recreation Club.

The Liaison committee reported that crushed stone was being hauled to complete the base for the parking lot-tennis court project. The socket bases for the posts are ready to be cemented into place as soon as enough gravel is hauled.

The grounds committee have scheduled a work party for the ball park on Tuesday, June 11 at 7:00. Also the club approved purchase of a lawn mower to help with the trimming of grass around trees, bleachers, etc. The new set of bases which were ordered earlier have not yet arrived.

The committee constructing the practice diamond reported that the pipe uprights have been cemented into place and that the remainder of the pipe has been delivered. The welding of the rest of the frame and the fencing should follow in a few days.

Most of the committees required for Sports Day were established. The parade will

begin at 1:00 p.m. starting from the Centennial Hall and ending at the ball park. The softball tournament, horseshoe and races, bingo, fish pond, concessions, etc. will take place immediately after the parade in the ball park.

In the evening there will be a dance in the Centennial Hall, also the Championship Softball game 50 - 50 draw. Don't forget the chicken barbecue plus many other items too numerous to mention.

The date is Saturday, August 10 - for Selkirk Sports Day. Bob Hare reported that the Pee Wee boys and Bantam girls softball teams require jerseys. Each team has some jerseys but may need additional to fully outfit the teams. Bob was given permission to look into the situation fully and purchase the required jerseys.

## Western Coal

der, by rail to Thunder Bay, and by the Cape Breton Miner to Nanticoke G.S.

The Nanticoke Generating Station is one of four Ontario Hydro stations assigned to test burn as much as 500,000 tons of coal from Alberta and British Columbia in 1974. The furnaces at Nanticoke G.S., Lambton (Sarnia), Hearn (Toronto) and Thunder Bay Generating Stations were designed to burn coal from Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Kentucky.

The average ton of Western Canadian coal has more ash, less combustible material, less heat and less sulphur than the American coal presently burned.

The trials will continue throughout the year to enable engineers and operators at the four stations to develop the new techniques and methods of using existing equipment to extract the maximum amount of energy from the new coal.

Although transportation charges make the cost of Western coal somewhat higher than the current cost of American supplies, the decision to research the feasibility of this source of supply was based upon numerous factors - a desire to develop Canadian industry, the rising costs of American coal, a possible American trend to use more coal to offset oil shortages (and hence, an uncertain future for Hydro in the U.S. coal market), and the need to develop fuel resources.

## Lot Levies Debated

City Engineer Ed Coates told councillors he felt the total levy of \$1,000 was reasonable. With the city he felt it's share would be spent putting in additional recreation facilities such as an arena in Jarvis or pool in Dover, increased fire protection and from the administrative point of view, he added, "we're crowded already".

Ward two councillor Jack Maythem agreed with the 30 - 70 split, but suggested it should be the other way around. The area has a lot more costs than the region, he said. Water and sewers, a regional responsibility, will be handled on a long term basis through levies, he added.

Harry Scott, Ward three councillor, spoke strongly against a lot levy. Instead he suggested asking a subdivider to put in a pool or buy a fire truck in lieu of a lot levy. He agreed water and sewer financing

is earned through a direct charge to the homeowner. As for arenas, he pointed out these are quite often built through public subscription.

Ward two councillor Robert Ryerse pointed out additional planning meetings, council meetings, lawyer fees, etc., would not be needed if newcomers were not moving in the area. He suggested these costs should be passed on to them through the lot levy.

Mr. Coates wondered how much the lot levy really affects the home's price suggesting it is based on supply and demand. If a guy can get \$60,000 for a \$50,000 home, he will be said. The recommendation was turned back to the public works committee for further consideration.
