

Marshall Slams Abortion Laws

David Marshall, the Liberal candidate for Norfolk - Haldimand, today proposed a sweeping new policy which would change totally the present abortion laws. Dr. Marshall said "The present law is inadequate. When Toronto General Hospital had more abortions than live births last year, as it did, something is wrong with the abortion laws in Canada. Abortions on demand are too easily obtained. The laws must be changed". Dr. Marshall specifically proposed a change in the constitution of

the boards considering abortion cases. He said the new boards would include a clergyman, and a layperson, as well as a member of the medical profession. Referral to this board would be on the basis of three letters from three independent doctors assessing the case from the medical point of view. Earlier diagnosis and referral to the board would be a pre-condition for consideration for abortion.

At present, hospitals have a committee of three doctors who pass cases, but themselves do not perform the abortions. "In practice," said Marshall, "this amounts to abortion on demand in many hospitals." Referring to last week's all - candidates meeting in Delhi, Dr. Marshall pointed out, "My opponent, Mr. Knowles, though against abortion on demand, said at that time the

present abortion laws are adequate. But the abortion statistics prove they're not, and that's why I've made these proposals". He continued, "The general aim of these proposals is to tighten up legislation which has proven ineffective and unequal in its application in Canada. These policy proposals will eliminate the use of abortion as another means of birth control". Marshall concluded,

"Such a law would encourage increased respect for the sanctity of human life as a basis for Christian morality in Canadian Society".

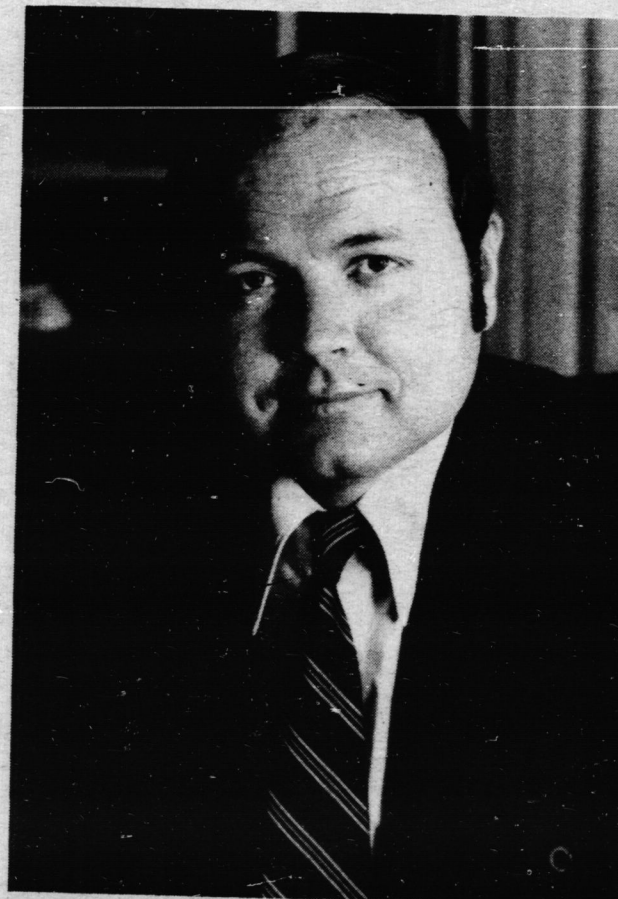
