## Stelco Says Nanticoke Project In Danger

Stelco's Nanticoke complex could be in "serious danger" if the government orders the company to roll back prices.

Peter Gordon, President of the Steel Company of Canada, said in Toronto last week that about 82 per cent of the company's profits were going into buying new machinery and expansion.

He added that although the question was "at this time hypothetical, if we did have to cut prices we would have to reconsider our Lake Erie expansion".

A federal commission investigating Stelco's latest price increases reconvened last week after an adjournment in the middle of last month.

The inquiry was ordered by Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau because of concern over the amount of the price increase - up to 12 per cent - at a time when

the government was asking for general restraint.

The company refused to roll back its prices and the government is powerless to do anything because of the failure of an anti-profiteering bill in the Commons.

Mr. Gordon said that he was not attempting to "confront or threaten" the government with his announcement that Nanticoke could be shelved.

"I'm just looking at the hypothetical case. I think it's obvious that if we have to roll back our prices, we just won't have the money available for this kind of expansion."

"I certainly hope it doesn't come to that. We're confident that our price increases are justified in the light of present circumstances".

Mr. Gordon said he expects the hearings to

continue until fall. Work is continuing at Nanticoke in the meantime.

Expansion at Lake Erie has already caused a furore with New Democratic Party officials charging that tax incentives are used to "feather the nests" of shareholders, rather than create new employment.

But Mr. Gordon claims that the incentives were an important factor in persuading Stelco to go ahead with its \$2 billion complex.

He added that critics said little employment had been created by the tax incentives: "But one can hardly expect permanent employment before the need exists".

However, about 2,500 construction workers will be employed at the peak of the Lake Erie program, and by 1977 there will be about 1,700 permanent employees at Nanticoke.

## On The Farm Front
