

Clark Tops Fast Field At Cayuga

Art Clark of West Seneca, N.Y., ran away from a 5 car battle for second place to capture the Carling feature race last Friday at Cayuga International Speedway. Clark took the lead from Doug Garner on the 1st lap of the 30 lap race for the Late Model "Super Stocks" and never looked back as he powered his '73 Camaro to a straight-away lead over the balance of the field to win his first regular feature race of the year at the 5/8 mile speed plant. Clark, however, had earlier won the special spring Carling 250 lap invitational and he took home the \$8,000. first place prize money for that event.

Bill Watson of Toronto in a '73 Firebird pulled away from four other hot shoes in the last two laps to take second spot by three car lengths over Jim Shipway of London. Doug Crocker of London, current NASCAR-Canada and Carling points leader Jerry Makara of Ancaster and Harold Brown of Brantford chased Shipway

across the finish line as the checkered flag fell. Shipway in a '74 Camaro, and Makara in a '69 Chevelle, had duelled all evening.

Makara won the third heat of the evening over Shipway, before Shipway reversed the tables taking the Late Model Trophy Dash over Makara by half a car length. Looking for running room behind this pair throughout the feature race, Doug Crocker finally took advantage of lapped cars to slip his '73 Monte Carlo under Makara coming off turn four in traffic on lap 29 for fourth spot.

Stroker McGurk of North Collins, N.Y. and Rich Wrobel of Elma, N.Y., made a strong showing for seventh and eighth spots after finally breaking out of the pack, but were unable to close the gap to challenge the leaders before the final flag. 24 cars started the feature event.
