We would like to invite parents and friends out to see these kids performing because they have spent a lot of time on their horses, and many of them are showing for their first time.

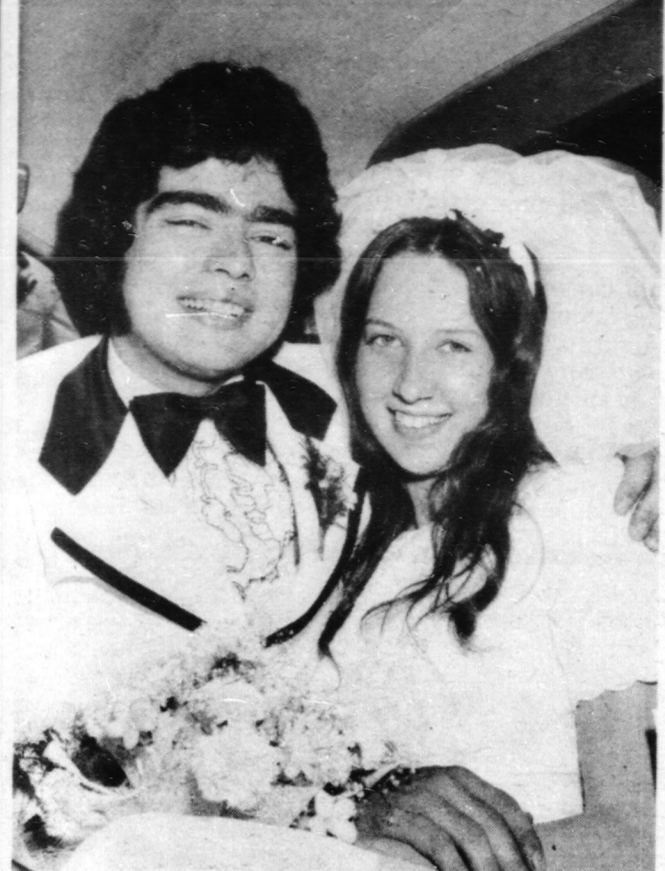

alone cost \$1,200 a piece.
Super Stock tractors can have all sorts of goodies bolted on the engine, but the tractor puller cannot do any internal work inside the stock engine block.
In the modified class, anything goes. The only rule is that agricultural tires must be used so the machine looks like a tractor. Many have up to four engines and one sported an Allison aircraft engine.
"Some of these fellows don't know how much horsepower they're pullin' with", the announcer told the crowd.
With limited fuel supplies, many of them using pressure tanks and fuel injection, the super tractors would not last in the field.
Willard Sallans, an association member, said that the tractor pullers do it for the pride and prestige of dragging the weight further than the next man.
"It's a hobby, for sure," he said.
Anyone interested in tractor pulling can figure one spending anywhere from \$35,000 to \$50,000 for the hot classes. Lesser classes and competition cost less money.
During Saturday afternoon 75 Canadian tractor pullers strutted their stuff in the Can-

adian pulls. Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon close to 150 international pullers were entered.
Mr. Sallans said that although there were no lady drivers entered in the event, many of the women know as much about the family tractor as their husbands.
He also said that most of the pullers are farmers, and few have any
