Hydro Employee Killed

A 48-year-old Hydro employee was killed near Jarvis Thursday night.

Raymond Edward McCaskie of R.R. 3, Bancroft, apparently failed to negotiate a stop sign, went across the intersection and collided with an earth mover parked on the opposite side of the road, a Simcoe O.P.P. officer told The Record.

The accident occurred at Norfolk County Road 43 and the Haldimand - Norfolk Line. Mr. McCaskie was alone at the time of the accident.

The Jarvis Fire Department was called to assist in releasing the body from the wreckage and were there for approximately one hour.

Coroner J.D. Hall of Port Dover pronounced him dead at the scene.
