will present to the Government of Canada a proposal to exempt farm labour from the Canada Pension Plan, Unemployment Insurance and Income Tax deduction at source, for periods of ninety days," he said. "This and only

this will alleviate the farm labour problems in areas such as ours with an influx of high paying industrial jobs".

Mr. Marshall termed Robert Stanfield's price and wage control policy as "recognized economic nonsense" and questioned its effectiveness when it becomes more flexible daily.

He queried the need for an election that is going "to cost the taxpayers of Canada approximately fifty million dollars - more than it would to fund cancer research for five years". And he felt the defeated budget had a lot to offer in the way of cheaper housing, increased benefits for veterans, inflation control and more.
