## Region Wants Greater Financial Aid

(continued from page 1)

The Engineering  
 Radio Communications  
 system needs \$52,000  
 while road re - num-  
 bering will require  
 \$20,000. The Region  
 requested 100 per cent  
 compensation for these  
 from Queen's Park.

The brief states  
 specific heavy financial  
 problems lie in water  
 and sewers, roads and  
 garbage disposal.

All of these services  
 will be under extreme  
 pressure because of the  
 expected population  
 influx.

The Region is already

proceeding with two  
 large projects - Expan-  
 sion of the Dunnville  
 Water Treatment Plant  
 at a cost of \$1,880,000.  
 Expansion of the Sew-  
 age Treatment Plant in  
 Caledonia at \$750,000.

Also the Region is  
 entering into an agree-  
 ment with the Ministry  
 of Environment to  
 increase Simcoe's  
 sewer system at an  
 anticipated cost of  
 \$2,250,000.

In the brief, the  
 region expressed con-  
 cern that, in expanding  
 sewer and water ser-  
 vices to meet the

immediate growth in  
 population, a heavy  
 burden will fall on the  
 existing property  
 owner. They requested  
 assistance to the  
 "extent that present  
 property owners are not  
 charged with excessive  
 amounts".

The Region also  
 found a large need for  
 adequate garbage dis-  
 posal sites requiring an  
 expenditure of several  
 thousand dollars in  
 the near future. They  
 asked for "one time  
 reimbursement of pur-  
 chase of three suitable  
 garbage sites or a

minimum of \$100,000 for  
 each of the three years  
 1974, 1975, and 1976, for  
 these capital pur-  
 poses".

The planning depart-  
 ment estimates for 1974  
 and 1975 are \$214,500  
 and \$365,600 respect-  
 ively. The Region wants  
 100 per cent reimburse-  
 ment for these two years  
 at least.

No reply has been  
 received from Mr.  
 White.
