Good wishes for a happy holiday to our adventurous members who are leaving for sunny Florida.

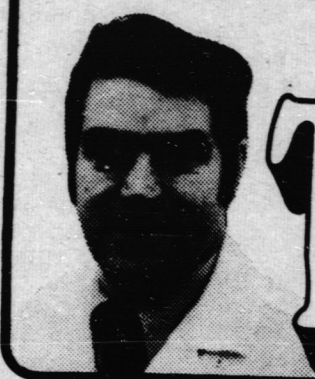
## Jarvis W.H.G.H. Unit
