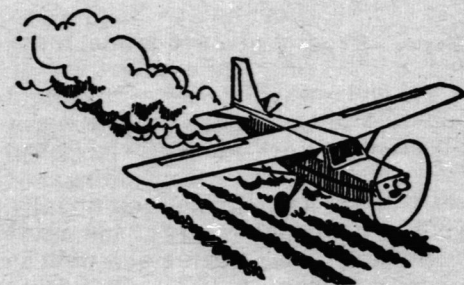
about drainage would be advised to make arrangements early. We understand the contractors are already booked for much of the season and tile is likely to be difficult to get.
