

Flyers Win 7 - 1 Over St. George

REFORMER - The OHA Southern Junior D Hockey League finals were forced to a seventh and deciding game. Hagersville Flyers, winners of the first two games of the best-of-seven series, forced the series to the limit with a 7 - 1 romp over St. George Lions before

1,400 fans in Hagersville Sunday.

St. George, regular-season first-place finishers, stormed back after dropping the first two games, to take the next three and the series lead. The deciding game was played in St. George Tuesday night.

Sunday night, Hagersville jumped in front 3 - 0 in the first period, outscored the visitors 3 - 1 in the middle stanza and then netted the lone goal of the final frame.

Thirty-three penalties were handed out in the game, with Hagersville serving 17 of them. Among the infractions were ten minute misconducts to Lions' Rob Simpson and Al Reeder in the middle period and a five-minute roughing call against Hagersville's Ross McKeen the last minute of the hockey game.

Tony Yacobino triggered two goals for the winners. He opened the scoring at 13:14 of the first period when

he banged in Bob Powell's passout. A booming slapshot was booted out by St. George's Ken Wehrstein, but Glen Hewson pounced on the rebound and flipped to Dean Webb who easily beat Wehrstein. Then at 14:53 Hagersville completed their first-period scoring with Paul McCarthy bulging the twine.

It took the Flyers less than two minutes to get on the board again in the second period as Yacobino netted his second of the night. Lions finally hit the scoresheet with Frank Donkers beating Hagersville netminder Kirk Brown for the lone Lions tally.

Goals by McKeen and Hewson completed the second-period scoring and then Terry Fryett rounded out the scoring at 9:28 of the final frame on a nice individual effort with Hagersville holding a man advantage.

Hagersville held a 50-44 edge in the shots on goal with Wehrstein facing 20 shots from the Flyers in the second period alone.

Hewson topped the point-getters with a goal and three assists. Yacobino had his two goals while Fryett and McKeen scored once and assisted on another for the winners.

Novice Trips Paris

The Hagersville Novice team continued their winning ways when they upset the powerful Paris team 4 - 3. This was the first defeat for the Paris Novice team in a good position for taking the playoff championship.

Paris picked up the first two goals and it looked like they would live up to their advanced notices of being good. Early in the second period Dennis Smith put Hagersville back in the game when he was set up by Chris Webber. Jerry McCarthy tied the score when he teamed with Todd LaForme for a goal. The period ended 2 - 2.

Dennis Smith scored his second of the night with Trevor Smith earning the assist. Tim Scott then carried the puck out to McCarthy who passed to Billy

Mumby for the winning goal.

Guy Dymont scored twice for Paris and was the best player on the ice. Jerry Smith was in goal for Hagersville and came up with some big saves. This team is now tied with Paris for top spot in the round robin playoff and will play at home on Wednesday nights at 6:30.
