Three Injured In Hwy. 6 Crash

Three area persons were injured in a head-on collision on Highway 6, just north of Hagersville early Sunday morning.

According to a Cayuga O. P. P. spokesman, eighteen-year-old Jeffrey Monture of R.R. 1, Onswen was driving north on the highway and Al Humphreys, 28, of 4 1/2 Main St. Hagersville was driving south when the two vehicles crashed. It was dark and snowing at the time.

Mr. Monture was transferred to the Hamilton General Hospital where he was described as "satisfactory" Monday. Hospital officials said Mr. Humphreys was "conscious and fair".

Mildred Walker, 26, of 26 Main St. N. Hagersville was treated at the West Haldimand General Hospital and released. She was a passenger in her own '66 Chevrolet which was

being driven by Mr. Humphreys at the time of the accident. Both her car and Mr. Monture's '65 Chev were described by Cayuga O.P.P. as total wrecks.

The accident occurred at 2 a.m. Sunday morning.

Last week, Community and Social Services Minister Rene Brunelle announced the 198 government of Ontario grants.

"Recreation centres have become a more integral part of community life," he said. "And the grants will help ensure ongoing programs in community centres and recreational activities for people of all ages, interests and backgrounds."

Or they will assist in the renovation and construction of recreational facilities.

Walpole will receive \$2,430.73. Other local recipients include: Cayuga - \$4,449.18; North Cayuga - \$3,824.18; Delhi - \$2,592.45.
