Approve New Town Concept For Area

(continued from page 1)
* Preservation of
present communities
cannot be effected if they
are pressured with
extreme growth.

Several councillors
refused to accept the
recommendation of the
concept without hearing
more definite reasons
for it and a detailed
explanation by Roger
Roberts, planning
director.

Mayor Pearson of
Caledonia felt council
was working backwards
on the matter by voting
on the concept without
hearing from the
planner. He said he
wouldn't support the new
town idea with a gun at
his head.

Mr. McCombs again
referred to the specu-
lation being carried out
in the area. "Time is
of the essence," he said.
And, he felt the province

should have some
guidance from council.

This thing has been
studied for four years
now, he continued.....
"we've got to get off
our tails and do some-
thing".

Simcoe Mayor Alfred
Judd told Mr. McCombs
he didn't feel it was fair
to request input immedi-
ately Thursday. "I
don't want to be the one
who has to make the
decision right now when
it has been sitting with
the province for months
and they wouldn't make
a decision". He said
he didn't want to pull a
rabbit out of a hat
Thursday with a gun at
his head.

Catharine Smale then
suggested Mr. Roberts
discuss the concept with
council right away.

The press and public
were ejected from the
room for an hour while

council went into Com-
mittee of the Whole.

Councillors then
accepted the plan and
recommended minist-
ers of Treasury, Econ-
omics and Intergovern-
mental Affairs, Housing
and Revenue be invited
to attend a special meet-
ing next Thursday after-
noon (April 9) following
the regular council
session.

Also, Mr. Roberts
will present a short
program to be under-
taken for identifying the
site.

No further explanat-
ion or justification for
selecting the new town
concept was given in
council for the public's
benefit.

Mr. McCombs did
later tell the Record
the new town concept

was preferred because
a public corporation
would control lots and
prices, thus cutting out
speculation. And, a new
town would be built the
way citizens want it.
Mr. McCombs said he
did not see any reason
why last Thursday's
discussion should have
been closed to the
public, but it was
regional council's wish.

He said he hoped the
next meeting with the
ministers will be open
to the press, but the
decision would again be
up to council.

At this next meeting,
councillor John Rox-
burgh has requested a
detail of the cost of
developing various town
sites and the amount of
provincial assistance
available.
