impose development controls in H - N to protect the land from speculative acquisition.

Slap on tight land use controls and zoning bylaws to prevent the transfer of land out of agricultural production,

he said. This may create some anger from people who want to leave farming, but it may be inevitable, he added.

Mr. Lewis recommended two other means of preserving agricultural land:

A provincial land bank where farmland is purchased by the government at market price and leased back to farmers at five per cent of the market value per year.

The third alternative and the one most favored by Mr. Lewis is to make farming a profitable venture.

The government should make a commitment of policy to provide the farmer with a reasonable profit, he said.

The failure of the PC government to make farming profitable has destroyed much of their support in rural Ontario, he claimed.

Mobile Servicing Cage

The repair and maintenance of suspended power lines requires the use of mobile cages or "skips" in which men move along the lines. A recent development in these cages come from Stanley E. Highland of Chilliwack, British Columbia. He has designed a skip

which can be used on steeply inclined power lines and passes over such obstacles as insulators and vibration dampers found along the lines. The invention is disclosed in Canadian Patent 943,897, granted to Mr. Highland on March 19, 1974.
