Seed treatment of corn will be more important this year if the weather continues to be cool and moist. Germination of corn seeds will be slow, resulting in more opportunities for seed and seedling rots, wireworms, and seed maggots to attack the seed and seedling corn plant.

The majority of seed corn is treated with a fungicide to help prevent seed and seedling rot. Most growers treat the seed with D and L (diazinon - lindane) to reduce the incidence of damage by wireworms and seed maggots. This simple job of seed treating is very important to getting a good stand of corn. If it doesn't get out of the ground, there won't be a corn crop
