Between May 15 and 24 is the optimum time to spray evergreens and birch trees. Evergreens are sprayed for mites and birch leaf miner. The birch leaf miner, a sunfly, winters in the soil and emerges as an adult in late May at which time the eggs are laid. The eggs hatch and the larva burrows in the leaf tissue. Control is only effective when the adults or larvae are still on the leaf. Most common tree and shrub sprays will control the insect if they are used at the proper time. Further information can be obtained in Publication 312 "Pest Control Chart for Ornamentals in the Home Garden" available at the Agricultural Office, Cayuga.

record each sale of farm assets. The tax department is knocking down on farmers who make verbal gifts or sale agreements.

Supper-table promises carry no weight. Tax people today demand that every transaction between farmers (farmer and son) be covered with the right piece of paper.

When transferring assets, the most important document is a well written bill of sale.

A bill of sale is a dated record of what is transferred, who is buying, who is selling and the amount and terms of the sale. It is especially important to record the sale of machinery, livestock, quota, feed and supplies. The bill is proof of sale and also proof of sale price for tax purposes.

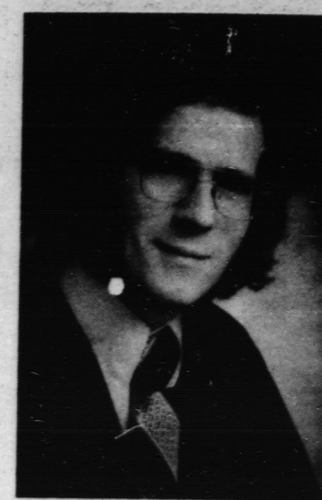

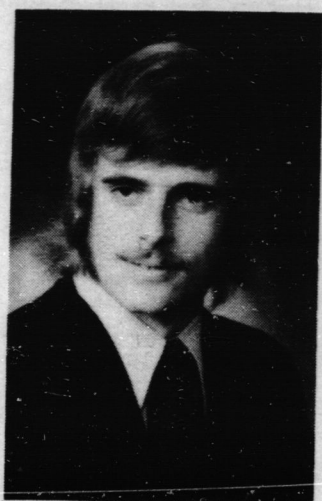

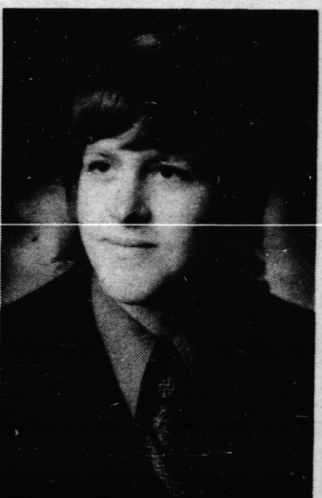
The ladies decided to save newspapers, books, cardboard boxes, etc. for recycling. These can be brought to the church or could be picked up.
