## Rebekah Friendship Night

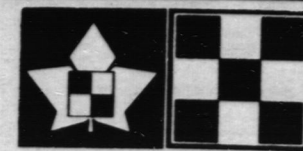
A large attendance

pianist.

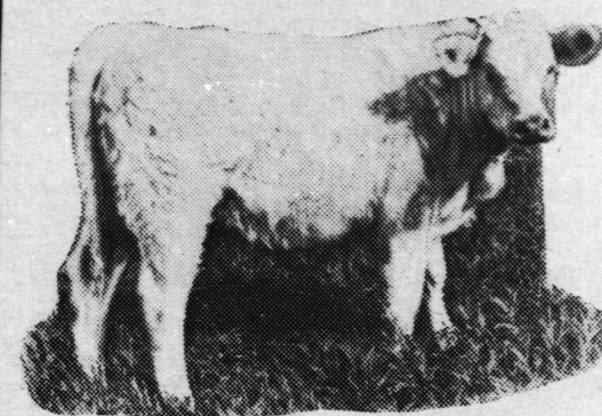
Mrs. Carol Misener
