## 3,000 More Acres Wanted White Picks Townsend

(continued from page 1)  
weeks, Mr. White continued.

And, in the fall it will  
be turned over to the  
Land Development  
Corporation, after it is  
legislated.

The Land Development  
Corporation will  
carry out the bulk of the  
city's planning, utiliz-  
ing the Planning and  
Development Act, he  
said.

The Haldimand-  
Norfolk regional  
planning department and  
committee will "make  
a full impact" serving  
on an advisory com-  
mittee and through  
public hearings, he  
added.

James N. Allen,  
MPP for Haldimand-  
Norfolk, told The  
Record Monday he was  
hardly an expert to judge  
the best site, but he

felt Mr. White made a  
fine decision.

He said the factors  
which carried the great-  
est influence in picking  
the site were probably  
a higher percentage of  
land was optioned in the  
Walpole - Townsend  
area and the prices are  
considered fairly  
reasonable.

One thing that has  
always intrigued him  
about the satellite city,  
he explained, is  
planners will be able  
to plan a city without  
the interference of  
existing urban prob-  
lems.

Mary Field of R.R. 4,  
Simcoe, a property  
owner along with her  
husband, Jim, in the  
Townsend site, dis-  
agreed with the  
Treasurer's decision.

This whole plan,

including the Nanticoke  
industrial project,  
should have gone farther  
north where there is a  
shorter growing season  
and then this land kept  
for agriculture, she told  
The Record.

"Although she thinks it  
is too bad the city will  
be located in the south-  
ern tip of the province,  
she can see the point  
of the developers - the  
area is flat and good for  
laying out.

Mayor John Pow of  
Nanticoke welcomed a  
decision from the  
province. He said it  
didn't matter personally  
to him which site -  
Townsend or Woodhouse  
- was picked. Looking  
at it for planning and de-  
velopment he said, the  
regional and local  
councils had to have  
this decision because  
a lot of planning centred  
around its location; e.g.  
roads and where to put  
a new office.

Mayor Pow expres-  
sed hope the city would  
not be allowed to grow  
too quickly and thus hurt  
the urban centres in up-  
grading their services.

He pointed out to  
The Record any assess-  
ment the city derives  
from industry which  
would put the municipa-  
lity in a favorable  
position will now be  
offset by the increased  
problems and needs of  
the city.

"We as a council  
will go along with the  
decision and do the best  
we can..." he added.

The original tender  
won by Culp Construc-  
tion for rebuilding the  
roof was for \$84,213.  
Two weeks ago,  
during heavy rains,  
water leaked through the  
roof "rather badly" onto  
the auditorium floor which subse-  
quently began heaving.

Board Administrator  
Bruce King told the  
Record last Thursday  
the contractor will be  
held responsible for any  
damages.

the H - N Joint Study  
report which rec-  
ommended the city be  
located in Woodhouse.

The consortium  
petitioned the govern-  
ment to change its mind  
and presented a report  
done by Professor  
Norman Pearson of  
Western University to  
back them up.

Mr. White told H-N  
regional councillors at  
a meeting in Cayuga May  
9th the consortium's  
property would cost the  
people of Ontario \$2,200  
per acre while the site  
recommended in the  
government report  
would cost approx-  
imately \$3,550 per acre.

The majority of coun-  
cillors favored the  
Townsend-Walpole site.  
Maxwell Goldhar of  
Revenue Properties, a  
member of the consor-  
tium, told the Record  
the terms of the options  
which will be picked up  
by the government are

25 per cent cash down  
and the balance paid  
over a five year period.

He further clarified  
that the \$1,944 average  
price per acre is the  
consortium's actual  
cost.
