
The Warriors scored first when Gary McKay took a pass from Wayne Walsh and beat Bill Downey with Hagersville a man short.

Simcoe scored three quick goals as the Hagersville team were picking up the borrowed shoes.


Yvon Poulin scored with Jaques Allard assisting. Robert McFaden made it 2-0 in the first period.
