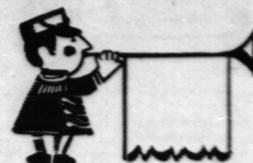


## Hagersville Highlights

###### Former Township Of Woodhouse

Please note the following changes in garbage collection schedules. The following areas of the former TOWNSHIP OF WOODHOUSE WILL HAVE GARBAGE COLLECTED ON WEDNESDAYS:

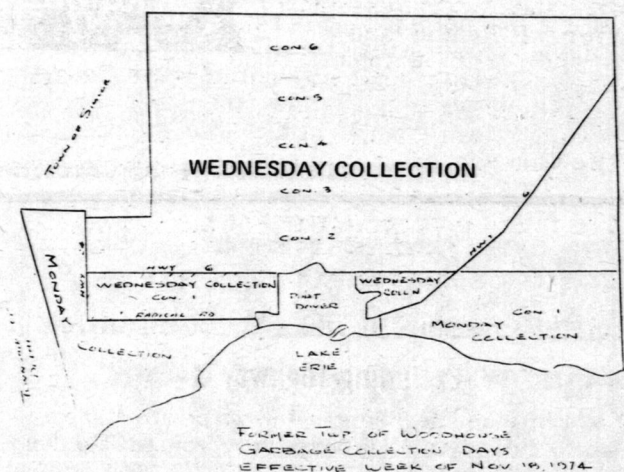
The area presently picked up on Tuesdays, being the area north of the roads between Concessions 1 & 2.

The area north of Radical Road on the west side of Port Dover bounded by the former limits of the Town of Port Dover and Highway No. 24, formerly picked up on Mondays.

The area on the east side of Port Dover, north of Highway No. 6 and bounded on the east side by the Town of Port Dover and formerly collected on Mondays.

Garbage will be collected on Mondays on the new boundary roads, (Radical Road and Nanticoke-Delhi Townline) on the west side of Port Dover and Highway No. 6, on the east side of Port Dover. The remainder of the former Township of Woodhouse will still have collection on Mondays.

THIS CHANGE IS EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 18TH, 1974.



As in the past, garbage should be placed at the side of the road prior to 7 a.m. in the morning on the day of collection or after 7 p.m. of the evening prior to collection. #### CITY OF NANTICOKE GARBAGE COLLECTION

##### Former Township Of Walpole - South Of And

##### Excluding Highway 3

Residents in the former Township of Walpole - excluding those who reside on Highway 3 are advised that a garbage collection contract for that area has been awarded to Mr. Ken Bartlett. Mr. Bartlett will commence pick-up on Tuesday, November 19th, 1974, of that area bounded by the former Walpole-Woodhouse Townline, the Lake Erie shore, the Brooklyn Sideroad, the Rainham Road, the Sandusk Road and the area in Concession 7 south of Highway 3. It should be noted that with regard to collection on the Sandusk Road, Tuesday collection will take place for those residents living in Concessions 1, 2, 4 and 6 only.

The east portion of this area of the former Township of Walpole will have collection on Wednesdays. Those residents living on the Sandusk Road in Concessions 3, 5 and 7 will have collection Wednesdays.

The following with regard to collection should be observed:

Persons residing on "private" roads, that is, roads not under the jurisdiction of the City of Nanticoke should put out garbage for collection by the City's contractor at the intersection of the nearest City road.

Persons residing on Highway 3 but having their laneways abutting the adjacent sideroad, should place garbage at the end of their laneway on the sideroad.

This contract is for the collection of household garbage and refuse only. This material is defined as waste and refuse from the household preparation of food including glass and metal containers, paper and plastic food containers and wrappings, discarded newspapers, metal and plastic containers, wearing apparel, household linen, packaging from household items other than food and waste, excluding large appliance packaging, generated by the normal operation of a household.

Garbage should be set out in containers or plastic bags securely bound.

Weight of said containers, bags or otherwise should not exceed forty (40) pounds.

Residents should place garbage along the shoulder of the travelled portion of the road.
