

FLYERS BLOW 4-0 LEAD**Simcoe Jets Come From Behind To Tie Flyers**

The Hagersville Flyers played like League champs for two periods on Sunday night building up a 4-0 lead over the undefeated Simcoe Jets right in Hagersville.

The Flyers either stopped skating or the Jets got refueled and really turned on the power in the last twenty minutes to skate off the ice with a tie game 4-4.

The largest crowd of the season was on hand for this game with Simcoe being well represented. With the Jets and Hagersville wearing the same colours it was hard to tell what fans belonged to what team until they scored. The Hagersville fans were very enthusiastic for the first 50 minutes and then like the Flyers decided to sit on their lead or LEAD as you prefer. Bill Downey was very sharp in goal and half-way through the second period people were thinking shutout as the Flyers were that well in control.

Hagersville was playing a man short when Glen Hewson intercepted

ted a pass outside the Jets blueline and after deking one defenceman he skated in and shoved the puck between Mike Pearce's legs. Randy Martin finished off a three-way passing play from Paul Fryett and Don Brown to make the score 2-0.

Dean Webb scored the prettiest goal of the night when he took a pass from Hewson right at the goal mouth and slid it into the goal. Pearce looked like he was playing Hewson to shoot and never had a chance on Webb's shot. Fryett started the play by digging the puck out and getting it to Hewson at center ice. The last Hagersville goal was scored by Bill Winkworth with a bullet-like drive from just inside the blueline. Ross McKeen and Glen set up the play with some neat passing.

At this point Simcoe came to life and scored a power play goal to end the second period 4-1. The Jets poured 15 shots at Downey in the last 20 minutes and three

more went by him.

The Flyers let down for six minutes and it was game over. Brad Smith scored unassisted to make it 4-2. Ron Wood shot his second of the game with Chris White and Smith getting assists. Fifty seconds later the little high scoring winger Frank Faludi popped in the tying goal from in

front of the net. The boys should know by now that Faludi can put the puck in the net and there's no way he should be loose.

The Flyers sat out 19 penalties with two of them being majors. Three of them were of the stupid variety. One time the Jets were assessed a major and would have played

shorthanded for a full five minutes, but the Hagersville players felt sorry for them and rapped a guy with a stick to equalize the man power advantage. The Flyers are the most penalized team in the league and whether the players know it or not, it is costing them points in the standings. Four or five players cannot

skate their tails off killing penalties and expect to have anything left to score goals with.

Let's start playing hockey on the ice instead of the penalty box and see if we can overtake the high-flying Jets.

The Flyers play Merriton at home this Sunday with game time 7:30.

executive, I personally feel it is our responsibility to provide a place for boys who are not good enough to play junior hockey here in our own association. If we let imports in it will mean several local boys will not make the team.

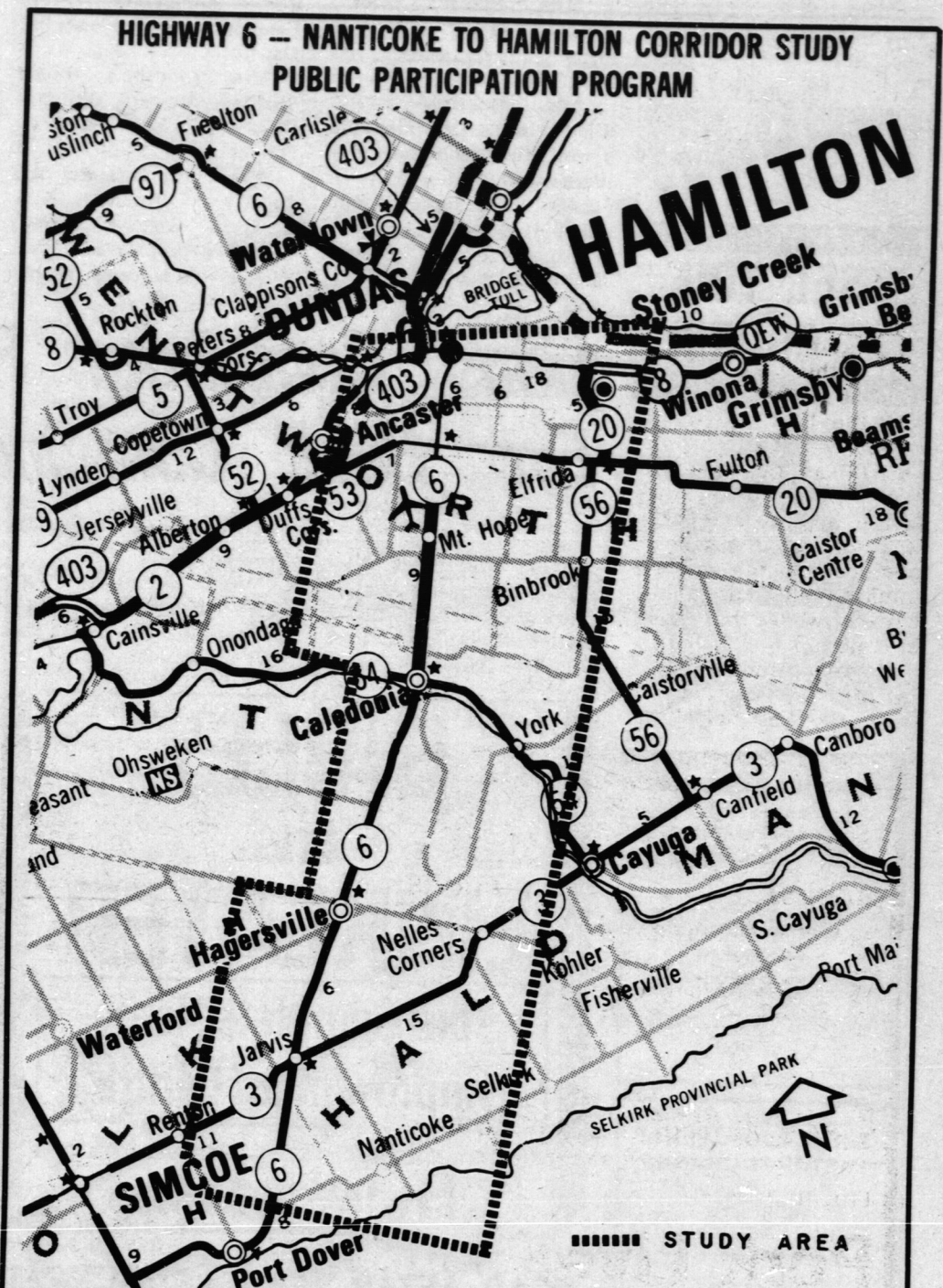

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications announces the first in a series of public meetings in connection with the Highway 6 Corridor Study to establish a new route for Highway 6 from Nanticoke to Hamilton.

Traffic congestion already evident on sections of Highway 6 and the increasing traffic flow to and from the developing Nanticoke industrial complex are two of the factors leading to the undertaking of the study at this time. In order to provide for pipelines and other utility services along the proposed new corridor, and to avoid an excess of rights-of-way, the possibility of a joint-use corridor will be explored in the over-all study.

Involvement of the public in the study is of great importance. Interested individuals and groups are asked to note the time and place of the meeting in their area and are urged to attend.
