(continued from page 1) and that part of a water treatment plant intruded into another wooded area. Engineers returned to their drawing boards to re-route the pipeline and relocate the water treatment plant to preserve the woodland.

The model also was useful in selecting locations for parking lots and temporary construction offices and warehouses, and in selecting harmonious colors for storage tanks.
