H-N Says Dangerous Traffic Conditions On Highway No. 3

Dust clouds and moving trucks from Cayuga Quarries' Highway 3 operations have come under the scrutiny of H - N Regional Council.

And they don't like what they see.

At a meeting in Cayuga last Thursday councillors endorsed a move to advise the Minister of Natural Resources and Minister of Transportation and Communication of their concern and request them to "take the necessary steps to eliminate the dangerous traffic conditions that exist on Highway 3 adjacent to the quarry operations" between Nelles Corners and Cayuga.

Since Mayor Alfred Judd emphasized the region's stand saying it is certainly a "hazard" coming along there. He suggested a delegation be sent to the ministers instead to get immediate action.

The Region feels there is a need for a long acceleration and east-bound trucks turning out of the quarry "due to the slow accelerating movement of these trucks," a deceleration lane for trucks coming from the east, a left-hand turning holding lane for trucks coming from the west and a through traffic passing lane.

Councillors don't feel the speed limit on Highway 3 should be lowered to accommodate the quarry operation, but rather Cayuga Quarries and Construction Ltd. should be made to adjust their operation to ensure the safe movement of through traffic.

H-N plans to alert the ministers to "the need for keeping down the dust clouds drifting across the highway." And they will ask that stone carried by the trucks be loaded safely

to avoid it falling off. "In particular, to avoid the fine material from blowing off the top of the truck and leaking through the bottom of the truck and leaking through the bottom of the truck at the rear" since "the truck loading conditions is dangerous for a motorist following behind."

They are also seeking information on what approvals have been given to the operation under the Pits and Quarries Act, details of the rehabilitation plan, details of the controls the Minister intends to enforce on this operation and any controls under the Ministry of Environment.
