Vinimum Wage Goes Up

A minimum wage of \$2.25 an hour for employees in general industry became effective throughout Ontario, October 1, 1974. The current rate of \$2.00 became effective January 1, 1974.

The minimum rate will apply to all employees except students under the age of 18. The student rate will be \$1.90 an hour.

The minimum rate for construction employees will increase from \$2.25 to \$2.50. Guards on

construction sites will receive the same rate. The purpose of the minimum wage is to give workers whose bargaining power is limited a measure of protection against exploitation. This is the second increase in the minimum wage this year and the minimum wage will be continually under review.

Three additional paid holidays will be added--New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Victoria Day, bringing the total to seven statutory holidays with pay. The other four holidays are: Good Friday, Labour Day, Dominion Day and Christmas


