Anglican Synod Meets Tomorrow

Close to 400 delegates lay and clerical, are expected to meet in Hamilton on Friday and Saturday for the 100th Synod of the Diocese of Niagara. The Synod is the legislative body of the Diocese which reaches from Niagara Falls to Mount Forest.

Keynote speaker at this meeting, which officially starts the centennial year, will be the Rt. Rev. John Howe, Secretary General of the world-wide Anglican Communion. Bishop Howe, formerly a Bishop of the Episcopal

Church in Scotland, coordinates the work of the various independent national and provincial churches that go to make up the Anglican Communion.

Canon Akisoferi Wesonga from Uganda will speak about the

overseas work of the church and Donald Shepherd the Canadian Church's Officer of the North will relate the pressing needs in northern Canada. The Diocese will be taking part in "Anglican Appeal 74" which will pump much needed capital into the northern work this year and next and will begin new overseas work in 1975.

Synod will debate a proposal to admit younger children to Holy Communion before Confirmation. This has been discussed in the eleven deaneries in the diocese

and their resolutions are expected to influence the decision.

Progress reports will be received about the Plan of Union, Clergy Stipends, and Goals and Objectives of the Diocese.

The Bishop of Rupert's Land, the Rt. Rev. Barry Valentine will make a presentation about two agreed statements on Ministry and the Eucharist worked out by a commission of Anglicans and Roman Catholics.

The Synod will be asked to amend its Canon Law to implement

the changes in organization approved at last year's Synod.

The two day meeting will begin with the Holy Eucharist in Christ's Church Cathedral at which time the Bishop will deliver his charge to the Synod, and will conclude with the premiere of the Diocese's Centennial film.

Local delegates are Murray Hodgson and Neale Hoover of Jarvis with Mrs. Eleanor Dosser as alternate, W.J. Hamilton of Nanticoke with Mrs. Mary Weaver as alternate, and the Rev. R.D. Perry.
