

Annual Haldimand Deanery A.C.W. Meeting Held In Nanticoke

The Annual Meeting of the Anglican Church Women of the Haldimand County Deanery was held in Christ Church, Nanticoke, Ontario.

The Holy Communion Service was celebrated by the Reverend Douglas Perry, assisted by the Reverend D.J. Eustace, Regional Dean. The altar was decorated with beautiful red roses in Memory of past members.

The organist was Mrs. William Snowden, Nanticoke. The Epistle was read by Mrs. Blake Fields, Nanticoke, and the Gospel was read by Rev. Eustace.

Rev. Eustace chose his topic according to the Centennial of the A.C.W.

Their beginning in 1880, then known as a Mission of Mercy, attended to the needy of poor communities and the slaves whom worked the underground mines. By 1920, it became known as the A.C.W.

(Anglican Church Women). By the year 1970 this organization had grown to 150 Branch Representatives. It had also become Missionary Minded from Mission Minded, and had become self-supporting. Nomination Of Candidates FOR THE HALDIMAND COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

NOTICE is hereby given that Candidates may be nominated for the Haldimand-County Board of Education by filing a nomination paper in the prescribed form with the Returning Officers at the Municipal Offices listed below during the normal working hours from Thursday, November 7th through Tuesday, November 12th, 1974.

THIRTEEN (13) MEMBERS TO BE ELECTED BY PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPPORTERS as follows:

TOWN OF DUNNVILLE - Four (4) Members to be elected.

One (1) Member for Area 1 - (Area 1 comprising of that part of the municipality known as Ward 1 and II and being the former Townships of Dunn and Canborough.)

One (1) Member for Area 2 - (Area 2 being that part of the municipality known as Ward III and being the former Townships of Moulton and Sherbrooke.)

Two (2) Members for Area 3 - (Area 3 being that part of the municipality commonly known as Ward 4 and being the former Town of Dunnville.)

Nomination Papers to be filed with the Returning Officer of the Town of Dunnville.

TOWN OF HALDIMAND - Seven (7) Members to be elected.

One (1) Member for Ward 1 (formerly the Town of Caledonia)

One (1) Member for Ward 2 (formerly the Township of Seneca)

One (1) Member for Ward 3 (formerly the Township of Oneida)

One (1) Member for Ward 4 (formerly the Village of Hagersville)

One (1) Member for Ward 6 (formerly the Village of Cayuga) combined with that portion of Ward 5 lying East of the Grand River (formerly the Township of North Cayuga)

One (1) Member for Ward 7 (formerly the Township of South Cayuga) combined with that portion of Ward 5 lying West of the Grand River (formerly the Township of North Cayuga)

One (1) Member for Ward 8 (formerly the Township of Rainham)

Nomination Papers to be filed with the Returning Officer of the Town of Haldimand.

CITY OF NANTICOKE - Two (2) Members to be elected.

Two (2) Members from Ward 1 (formerly the Township of Walpole, Village of Jarvis and Police Village of Selkirk save and except that portion of the Township of Walpole which was transferred to the Town of Haldimand)

Nomination Papers to be filed with the Returning Officer of the City of Nanticoke.

ONE (1) MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE SEPARATE SCHOOL SUPPORTERS ON THE HALDIMAND COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION to be elected at large from the combined area of the Town of Dunnville, Town of Haldimand and City of Nanticoke, (Ward 1, formerly known as the old geographic County of Haldimand.)

Nomination Papers for the Separate School Representative will be filed with the Returning Officer of the Town of Haldimand.

CANDIDATES are required to submit nominations on prescribed forms only. Such forms may be obtained from the Municipal Offices listed below.

NOTICE is also given that the Municipal Elections Act, 1972 provides that a Nomination Paper:

- (a) Shall be signed by at least ten (10) electors whose names are entered in the Polling Lists of Electors entitled to vote in an election to such office;
- (b) Shall state the name, occupation and address of the candidate in such a manner as will identify him and the office for which he is nominated;
- (c) Shall state the name and address of each elector signing the nomination paper.

TAKE NOTICE that where the candidate is running in a Ward, his Nomination Paper must be signed by persons on the Polling List of Electors in that specific Ward.

NOTE:

In accordance with Section 34(3)(4) of The Municipal Election Act, 1972, a Nomination Paper nominating a candidate for

(a) Public School Board member shall be signed by Public School electors only; and

(b) Separate School Board members shall be signed by Separate School electors only.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE THAT THE ONUS IS ON THE PERSON NOMINATED FOR ELECTION TO AN OFFICE TO FILE A BONA FIDE NOMINATION PAPER.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that a candidate may withdraw his nomination by filing an instrument in writing, verified by his affidavit and delivered to the Returning Officer before 5 o'clock in the afternoon on Wednesday, November 13th, 1974.
