Ink Trails

Sheep
A century ago much was written about the wars between sheepmen and cattlemen. It seemed the cattlemen always came out on top while the sheep rancher was supposed to be something not to be desired. One would wonder if this attitude still lingers in the subconscious mind of today.

Many great tales have been told of the great cattlemen and their trail drives, creating a romantic background for present day cattlemen and in particular, the new glamour breeds. Even hogs get some attention from government agencies, the media and command a place on the farm scene. Fish too, have made great strides in popularity on the dining room table. But only

after the Maritime Provincial Government began to assist in giving publicity to the producers of sea foods.

However, sheep that were to be seen on almost any farm 40 years ago have all but disappeared from the rural scene. Why?

This week, in the course of several days of driving around the countryside, I saw only two flocks of sheep.

As I recall, the publicity I have seen regarding "Spring Lamb" was advertised as "New Zealand Spring Lamb." Yet the best lamb I ever tasted was a leg of lamb I bought from a farmer near Bancroft, Ont.

I am prompted to mention this because of a story I read recently about a sheep ranch in Australia where it took thousands of acres to raise a flock of 3000 sheep. And the rancher lost one - third as a result of thirst and starvation. Even a grasshopper could starve behind a flock of sheep in some parts of the northern section of that country.

In a questionnaire sent out by some Provincial Governments,

many questions are asked. Included are: How many cattle do you have? How much milk do you produce? How many beef cattle do you produce? - etc. and also various questions about hog activities.

However, the same questionnaire does not even mention sheep or leave a space for them. We never seem to be bombarded with the wonderful merits of Spring Lamb and only on rare occasions do we see it on the menu of a restaurant.

Unless there is a reversal of this negative attitude of no assistance for marketing, control of wolves, and other various problems, sheep production will become a forgotten agricultural industry and with that, the wool industry will face complete ruin.

I can't remember when I have seen lamb on the meat counter.

out. Maybe this will help.

Although the Labour Pool is only a month old, Haldimand Agricultural representative, Ken Best is already talking of future expansion.

The Haldimand Area Pool is geared to general farm work assistance. And as it goes through the mill, he said, it will probably be called upon to serve Wentworth and that part of Norfolk which is not in tobacco production.

The need for such a board in this area was nurtured by the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture and has the support and representation of the Haldimand

Milk Board, Haldimand Holstein Club, Pork Producers, Vegetable Growers, Junior Farmers, Christian Farmers Federation and Poultry Producers.

Thirty job placements have been made so far, Mr. Hodgson told The Record and now there is a limited amount of help for the milk relief service program.

He stressed, however, they cannot find help on 20 minute notice as some people believe. The Labour Pool needs time in order to make arrangements.
