

# Harvesters Sweep Caledonia Tournament

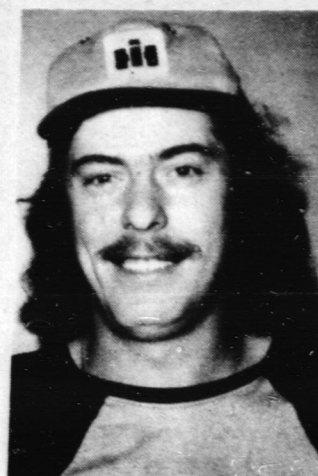
Fehrman and McKeen Win Trophies

The Jarvis Harvesters rebounded from their worst O.A.S.A. playoff in history to win the Labour Day weekend tournament played at Caledonia.

The Harvesters played five games and won them all to take the first place prize money and the individual awards.

Hub Fehrman, the playing coach of the Harvesters, was named the most valuable pitcher in the tournament and Fred McKeen, the Jarvis shortstop, was named the most valuable player for the entire tournament.

Hub pitched two wins for the Harvesters and relieved brother Darryll in the third game. The Jarvis coach allowed only two runs in his three appearances and walked only two batters. In the 2-0 win over Binbrook on Monday morning, Hub hit a homerun and scored the second run himself while allowing only one hit. The lone single

came in the last inning with one out.

Fred McKeen played short the way he used to; picking up everything hit his way. McKeen handled 23 chances in the tournament without making an error. Several of the balls he handled were of the sensational type, but he made them look easy. His steady play influenced the rest of the team as Jarvis made only two errors in the entire tournament.

### DOWN DESERONTO 8-6 IN 10 INNINGS

## Midgets Advance To Semi-Finals

The Hagersville Midgets travelled to Deseronto for the third and deciding game of their series on Sunday and came home with a thrilling 8-6 win in ten innings.

Deseronto drew first blood as they scored an

unearned run in the first inning. The Hagersville boys appeared nervous as they made two more errors in the second frame and allowed the home town team to score their second run.

In the sixth Deseronto scored three times when they picked up a walk two singles and a double. They scored their final run in the 8th on an error, single and a wild pitch.

Bill Winger started on the hill for Hagersville and pitched six and one-third innings. Phil Nie who had played an outstanding game at short relieved Winger with two out in the 7th and limited the Deseronto team to one unearned run and two hits

### Game Five - Jarvis 3, Binbrook 0

The championship game was a classic and a real tribute to two fine teams. It was also fitting that this game would be the climax to a really well organized and well run tournament.

It took Jarvis eleven innings before they had the championship and it also took some clutch pitching by Darryll Fehrman to sew up the win. Like true Harvesters, they got the job done just before the rains came.

Darryll pitched a three hit shutout striking out only four while walking just two. He hit three batters, but two of them were Binbrook's big guns, Richardson and Moore.

Craddock, Phibbs, Smith and Paul Kett, who had two hits, were the only ones to hit safely over the first ten innings.

Ken Graham led off the 11th inning with a single. Bill Prince hit a shot at second that Moore picked up and turned into a double play.

It looked like the game would go into the 12th inning when Phibbs singled. McKeen singled and Jim Lamb came up with his first hit of the night to drive in two runs. Bryan Smith hit a ball through short and the score was 3-0.

Fehrman wanted to add a little spice to the game so he walked the first two men he faced in the last half of the inning. Brother Hub went out and gave him a few words of wisdom and the next three batters went down in order. That meant the championship for the Harvesters and salvaged part of the season for a tired bunch of players.

### Game One - Jarvis 3, Fisherville 0

In the first game Jarvis faced Fisherville and came up with a 3-0 win. Marve Fehrman worked this game and pitched a four hitter. Marve struck out 11 without walking a man. L. Nagel, J. Nagel, B. Otterman and N. Pantzouri hit safely for Fisherville.

Jarvis scored all their runs in the 5th inning. Terry Dossier was safe on an error and

Bruce Biggar sacrificed him to second. Marve Fehrman, who got two hits in the game, singled. Paul Kett smashed a homerun to wrap up the scoring. Fred McKeen Bill Prince and Jim Lamb picked up the other hits.

### Game Two - Jarvis 3, Tillsonburg 1

Tillsonburg worked the Fehrman brothers over for a total of nine hits in this game but could score only one run. This came in the 6th inning when they had four hits, but could only cross the plate once. This was the game where Hub came on in relief of Darryll and put out the fire with the bases loaded and only one out.

The Harvesters scored two runs in the second inning without a hit. Ted Phibbs walked and McKeen was safe on an error. Two passed balls and another error by the first baseman sent two runs home.

Oddly enough in the third inning, Dennis Craddock, Bill Prince and McKeen singled but the Harvesters picked up only one run.

### Game Three - Jarvis 3, Hespeler 2

In the third game Jarvis staked Hub Fehrman to an early two run first inning lead and added another in the second to make the portly right hander's job a lot simpler.

Craddock opened the game with a single. With two out Ted Phibbs hit a ball to left field that was booted. Fred McKeen singled and the score was 2-0.

Bryan Smith led off the second with a triple and trotted home when Ken Graham lifted a fly ball to deep right field. That was all the runs Hub needed as he shut out Hespeler till the last of the 5th.

Three singles and a sacrifice fly gave last year's Intermediate 'B' champions two runs but Fehrman bore down to retire the last seven men in a row. This win assured Jarvis of at least a shot at the finals to be played on Monday.

### Game Four - Jarvis 2, Binbrook 0

In one of the fastest and best played games of the tournament the Harvesters shut out a tough Binbrook team by a score of 2-0. This game was all Hub as he pitched the one hit shutout, hit a home run and scored the second run himself. Hub faced only 23 men in the seven inning contest. Along with his two hits Phibbs and Ken Graham also had two hits as the Harvesters picked up nine in this game. Craddock, Prince and Jim Lamb had the others.
