## Midgets Win Championship

The Hagersville Midgets won the Southern Counties Championship on Saturday by downing Paris 10 - 2 in a game played in Paris.

Bill Winger was at his best. He allowed only three hits in going the distance. He struck out five and walked two with both runs being unearned. This is the type of game coach Nat Salvatore knew the boys could play and was quite proud of the entire team effort. With Winger's steady pitching, the entire team played well.

Darrell Watson was the big gun at the plate leading the hitters with four safe ties. Ralph Awde had a triple and two singles with Darryl Nixon getting a double and two singles. Bill Winger helped his own cause with two hits with men on base each time. Paul Horvatis, Richard Salvatore and Mike Liscombe picked up the other hits. Liscombe who played for the Bantams all season was on base two other times and came around to score.

Paris scored in the first inning on an error and a single by Mat Cline. The error came with two out. Winger threw goose eggs at Paris till the 8th inning when Hagersville made two more errors to go along with their third hit of the game for another run. Hagersville got on the scoreboard in the first inning. Salvatore reached base on an error. Watson singled and both boys pulled off a double steal. Liscombe was safe on an error before Nixon cracked his double.

Horvatis started the third inning off by reaching first on an error. Watson and Salvatore followed with singles. Awde came through with a single and Winger chased two more runs home with a single to make the score 6 - 1. Hagersville wrapped it up in the 4th with four more runs and the last of their scoring. Watson singled with one out. Salvatore walked and Liscombe was hit by the pitcher. Nixon singled and Awde tripled. Winger then singled for the final run.

This is the fourth time in six years that Nat Salvatore has coached this bunch of boys to the S.C.B.A. championship and we all hope that 1975 will bring an O.B.A. title to the area with this team. Nat would like to say thanks to his coaches Steve Petracca and Frank Salvatore who helped him this season. Thanks to Norm Crawford and Estell Winger who drove to every away game and special thanks to Dave Kett who supplied a car when there was no other transportation available.
