No Fault Insurance Discussed At Fisherville Lions

The regular dinner meeting of the Fisherville District Lions was held at the community hall in Fisherville on September 17th. A delicious pork dinner was catered to by the ladies of Trinity Lutheran Church. During dinner, a rousing sing song was led by Lions' Ernie Hoover, Earl Kiefer and Bill Clarke. The lucky draw was won by Lion Charlie Stadler.

The members were sorry to learn that Lion Sid Cronk is a patient in St. Joseph's Hospital in Hamilton. Lion Sid has been an active member of our Club and everyone certainly wishes him a speedy recovery.

Lion Chief Don Willis called upon Secretary Jim Edmundson to read the minutes of the last regular meeting and Directors meeting. Lion

Jim reported that five Directors will be attending a Zone Advisory meeting at Port Dover on September 25th. He further reported that our annual beef draw will be held on November 23rd. Tickets will be available to the members shortly. The Directors moved that \$2,000 be taken from the activities account and be applied against the indebtedness outstanding on the Medical Centre. A \$25.00 donation was received from the Selkirk Recreation Committee for the use by them of our fryers for their Sports Day.

Our Treasurer, Lion Milford Hartwick, reported that after the above mentioned \$2,000 has been applied against the Medical Centre loan, we now have a balance owing of \$4,000.

Our guest speaker for the evening was introduced by Lion Al Scott. He was Frank Melinka, who is an Underwriter for Canadian General Insurance in Toronto. He spoke on No Fault Insurance and the sweeping changes that will go into effect in 1975.

Mr. Melinka stated that the present system has resulted in a very slow process for anyone attempting to receive compensation for damages, etc. He cited the huge accident near Barrie two winters ago. He mentioned the lawyers are still battling to find who actually was responsible. Consequently, no claims have been settled to date. The new system will allow immediate compensation because you will deal directly with

your own Company and agent who will be compelled to settle your claim immediately.

In addition, he mentioned that everyone will be compelled to buy insurance. This will result in more returns and thus should reduce the rates quite substantially. Mr. Melinka stated that it is quite a complex plan and time didn't allow him to go into full details. However, he left us with the thought that if everything goes as planned, rates could reduce by as much as 20%. Lion Karl Benner thanked Mr. Melinka for his very informative speech.
