Cheapside United damaged in Easter fire

had held a sunrise service earlier in the morning. The service was followed by breakfast served in the basement.

Reverend Arnold Creaser said a congregational meeting will be held tomorrow to decide what should be done about the fire damage. The church was partially insured, he said.

"We have already been offered the use of five churches in the Selkirk area if we can't get back to ours for some time," Mr. Creaser said. "Everybody has been pitching in trying to help."

At the time of the blaze Reverend Creaser was officiating at a ceremony at Nanticoke. He noticed that something was amiss when

someone came into the service and took a man out who draws water. Later in the service Rev. Creaser's wife came to the front of the church and announced that there had been a fire at Cheapside.

By the time Rev. Creaser got to the church the fire was out and men were clearing up rubble while

women were mopping up the water upstairs.

Six firefighters managed to carry the church's nearly new organ out of the smoke filled church.

Two firefighters, Fergie Heastont and Bill Van Brocklin were treated for smoke inhalation.

Rev. Creaser said there were a number of paintings and other items that could never be replaced. The basement consisted of a fellowship room, a Sunday school room and a kitchen.

Recently the presbytery has been studying the situation of mergers. It isn't known now how this fire will affect that.

"It is going to take a lot of elbow grease and hard work to clean up the church," said Rev. Creaser. "The water has taken the finish off the floors and the smoke has stained the windows. We would hope that this hardship will bring

the people of the congregation closer together."

Region grabs \$60,000 deal

The third system, at a one to 5,000 scale derived mapping, is taken from the one to 10,000 scale although the region may select any area and have it mapped at a one to 5,000 scale. The cost of this system would also be born entirely by the provincial government.

Mr. Durrant pointed out to council that the \$60,000 cost can be broken down into two budget years at a \$30,000 cost per year.

Mr. Durrant impressed upon council that the mapping system is "an excellent one. It is a basic tool for planning as well as engineering. We are getting this at a very defrayed cost. If we had to do it on our own in a couple of years, it would cost us in excess of a million dollars."

Mr. Durrant also told council that it is possible to receive the rest of the mapping package for free without the one to 5,000

scale mapping, subject to approval from the Provincial Management Board.

Regional Council passed the entire recommendation, but approval must still come from the Management Board. If the Management Board rejects the proposal Haldimand-Norfolk will not receive the one-to 5,000 scale mapping at 25 per cent cost.
