

Minister announces increased student assistance

Ontario will provide about \$47 million in direct financial assistance to students in the 1975-76 academic year. Details of student assistance programs, including two new programs, were announced

in the Ontario Legislature March 18, 1975 by the Hon. James A.C. Auld, Minister of Colleges and Universities. The new programs are the Ontario Student Loans Plan, which is intended to help many of the students

ineligible for aid from the federal government's Canada Students Loans Plan, and the Ontario Special Bursary Program, which will provide up to \$500,000 to help the most needy part-time students.

Mr. Auld also announced that expenditures on the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) will be increased by approximately 16% to \$46.55 million. The allowance under OSAP for students living away from home will be increased to a maximum of \$57.50 per week, up 18.5% from a maximum of \$48.50 per week in the current year.

Ontario Student Assistance Program

OSAP provides assistance to full-time, post-secondary students who are unable to pay the full costs of their education and related expenses. About two out of every five students in Ontario receive financial aid from the program.

Over a normal academic year students eligible for assistance receive the first \$800 as a loan under the federal government's Canada Student Loans Plan, which is administered through OSAP in Ontario. Students who qualify for additional assistance receive

it from the province in the form of a non-repayable grant.

Mr. Auld said that the \$800 loan ceiling would be retained in 1975-76, although federal regulations would permit its being raised as high as \$1,800.

Mr. Auld also said that the board and lodging allowance for students receiving aid from OSAP and living away from home will be increased from \$32 to \$40 per week; the allowance for miscellaneous expenses, which was increased from \$9.80 to \$11.50 per week in the current year, will remain at \$11.50; and local transportation allowances will be increased to \$3 and \$6 per week, depending how far the student lives from campus. The allowances in the current year are \$2.50 and \$5. These changes bring total living allowances to \$54.50 or \$57.50 per week.

Mr. Auld repeated a promise made in November 18 last year that tuition fees in 1975-76 will not be increased.

"These measures — maintaining the current loan ceiling, increasing living allowances and freezing tuition fees — should enable students to enjoy a modestly improved standard of living despite the pressures of inflation," he said.

The Minister also announced other changes to OSAP, as follows:

* the amount students are expected to save from their summer earnings will

be increased in proportion to increases in the minimum wage;

* the amount parents are expected to contribute to students' expenses will be based on their actual 1974 earnings rather than their estimated 1975 earnings;

* students will have the option of applying for loan assistance only, rather than loan and grant. This option will enable them to obtain more money, although all of it will eventually have to be repaid.

Ontario Special Bursary Program

The new Ontario Special Bursary Program will aid people in serious financial need who may be able to improve their financial situation by taking one or more post-secondary courses.

Applicants to the program must be receiving social assistance, be unemployed or have a low family income.

People eligible for assistance will receive funds to cover the costs of their tuition, other compulsory fees, books and equipment. They may also receive an additional allowance of up to \$125 per term to help meet exceptional costs such as baby-sitting, day care or unusual transportation expenses.

The program is based on a successful pilot program of bursaries for part-time students which has been in operation at a limited number of institutions since 1973.

Ontario universities, colleges of applied arts and technology, Ryerson Polytechnical Institute and the Ontario College of Art have been invited to participate in the Ontario Special Bursary Program.
