Union Gas

The postal strike is finally over and the backlog of mail is gradually being cleared - it won't be long before the Christmas rush starts. So how can a little boy or girl be sure that all-important letter to Santa will get through?

One way is to send that letter by Claus Express - the special delivery set up by Union Gas especially for Santa's mail.

Claus Express, announced last week while the strikewas in progress, is still operating - just to make sure Santa's mail gets through on time.

Letters from Santa will be accepted at any Union Gas office. Union Gas offices are located in Windsor, Chatham, London, St. Thomas, Sarnia, Woodstock, Waterloo, Hamilton, Oakville, Burlington, Simcoe, Stratford, Guelph, Cambridge, Owen Sound, and Brantford, as well as in a number of smaller centres across southwestern Ontario.

On Monday, Dec. 15, the boxes will be cleared and the letters will be delivered to Canadian Arctic Gas Pipeline Limited in Toronto. From there Canadian Arctic Gas Pipeline Limited will transport Santa's mail by airplane to its most northerly office in Inuvik, Northwest Territories.

Inuvik is a convenient spot for Santa to pick up his mail. It's only about two hours "by reindeer" from the North Pole - a practice run for Rudolph and the gang before the big trip on Christmas Eve.

If you have a letter for Santa, or if you know someone who does, bring it to any Union Gas office by Dec. 15.

POLICE REPORT

Some of those glad bags contain more than just garbage.

Ontario CAREER

Action

Available to unemployed persons,
aged 16 to 24, under the Ontario
Career Action Program.

Program

More than half of the unemployed in the Province are young people. Because of this, the Ontario Government has created a work experience program, with a living allowance, that is designed to help young job seekers find gainful employment.

To be eligible, you must be at least 16 years old, but less than 25 years of age, and you must be unemployed, but actively seeking employment. You must not now be receiving full-time formal education.

Assistance includes on-the-job training plus an allowance of \$100 per week up to a maximum of 52 weeks. The aim is to provide the guidance and experience necessary for employment in private business or industry. The Ontario

Government and Canada Manpower will assist trainees in their search for employment. To apply, fill out an application form at your local Canada Manpower Centre. Final selection of applicants and allocation of training assignments will be made by the Government of Ontario.

The first program begins January 1976. Apply soon. Further information about the program is available at your Canada Manpower Centre. The Ontario Career Action Program is administered by the Ontario Ministry of Colleges and Universities in cooperation with the Ontario Youth Secretariat.
