Flyers take two games from Glanbrook

The Hagersville Flyers picked up two wins in the past week both at the expense of the Glanbrook Rangers. The first game was won by the Flyers 8-6 right in Glanbrook.

The Flyers led 2-1 after the first period and 5-3 after two periods before trading 6 goals in the last 20 minutes. Jim Nagel took a pass from Anthony Yacobino for the first goal of the game before Sandy Gibbons made it 2-0 with Dean Webb picking up the assist. Jim Arnes tipped in Ron Fuller's pass for the only Glanbrook goal of the period. Dennis Smith, Yacobino and Paul Fryett scored in the middle frame for the Flyers with Bill Nagel, and Fryett getting assists. Ron Murza scored both goals for the Rangers with Paul Jenkins assisting.

Craig McKeen, Jim Nagel and Yacobino with his second of the night rounded out the scoring for the Flyers as Glen Hewson and Yacobino also had assists. Daryl Wells scored two third period goals for Glanbrook and Ron Murza finished off his hat trick with his third of the night. The Rangers picked up nine of the fifteen penalties called including three majors and a gross misconduct to assistant coach Herb Dickenson. Hagersville had two majors in their total.

Playing at home on Sunday night the Flyers really poured it on the visitors winning

8-3. This was a close checking 1-0 hockey game for the first twenty minutes before the Flyers hammered in four goals in the second period and added three more in the final twenty minutes. The Rangers beat Bill Downey for a goal in the second period and twice in the final period. Darrell Watson was the top scorer for the Flyers as he scored three times. Single goals went to Craig McKeen, Kevin Smith, Dean Webb, Roger Montour and Anthony Yacobino. Brian Martin picked up three assists as Dennis Smith added two more. Jim Nagel did not pick up a goal but had two assists as did Glen Hewson. Watson's second goal of the night proved to be the winner as he was set up by Hewson. John Lundgren, Jim Arnes, and Kevin Grahm scored for the visitors. Four of the Flyers goals came off power plays which has been almost non-existent for several years. Referee Bob Elliott handed out 38 penalties 19 to each side. With all his trouble he still missed 19 more. The penalties were all minors except two misconducts and one high sticking major.

This Sunday the Flyers host Merritton with game time at 7:30 and this should be a good game. This will wrap up a busy ten day schedule for the Flyers as they pick up most of their games that they trailed in the schedule.

The Hagersville Flyers scored five third period goals to salvage a 7-7 tie with front running Dunnville Terriers. The Terriers led 3-0 after the first period, 3-2 after the second period and 6-3 early in the third period. Dennis Smith started the Flyers on the road back with the first goal of the game for the Flyers when he was set up by Kevin Smith. Before the second period ended Dennis had scored his second goal to send the teams to the dressing room one goal apart. Jean Drouin had scored twice for Dunnville and Dave Fenyes had tallied once. In the third period the Flyers scored in the first minute when Paul McSorley and Dennis Smith fed Darrell

Watson the puck and he fired it home. The Terriers then scored three times in seven minutes to take a 6-3 lead. With time running out it looked as if the Flyers were done. With 22 seconds left Brian Martin fed the puck to Tony Yacobino who in turn got it to Glen Hewson who fired it past Dave Silverthorne for the tying goal. This was a crowd pleasing hockey game with a lot of action packed into the last twenty minutes. Dunnville was assessed 38 minutes in penalties by Jack Clancy as the Flyers sat out 28 minutes proving Hagersville can play as well as anyone if they keep out of the penalty box. Five of the Flyers goals came on the power play making it nine in two games. After all these years it seems the boys realize they have defence back at the point.
