Brown kept juggling his lines and coach Don Stewart had to, as some of his players were not on hand. Then he lost the services of high scoring Tom Lyne through a major misconduct.

Mike Brodie opened the scoring with a goal at the six minute mark for the Jets, with Tom Lyne assisting. Simcoe also hit the post and a cross bar in the first period, but could manage only one goal. Bill Downey was at his best for this game and made plenty of impossible stops.

Terriers Mauled Flyers

The Dunnville Terriers came to town on Sunday night and completely mauled the Hagersville Flyers and went home with a 12-5 win. The two points they picked up helped them in their battle for first place as they remained three points ahead of Simcoe. If the Flyers had any choice as to whom they would like to play, it would appear that they want to meet Dunnville in the first round. If they could have knocked off Dunnville, Simcoe would have been in a good position to finish first. The first place team meets the third place team and the second and fourth teams play-off. The final week will tell who finishes first, Simcoe or Dunnville, with the top team meeting Hagersville.

The Flyers jumped into a 2-0 first period lead as Glen Hewson got the puck to Tony Yacobino for the first score of the game. Greg Ross made it 2-0 when he finished off a three way passing play with Craig McKeen and Bob Powless. The teams left the ice with the Flyers ahead 2-0 as they served three of the five penalties handed out in the frame. The one penalty to the Terriers was a 10 minute major for fighting while Hagersville sat out only a two minute minor. This gave the Flyers a possible man advantage for a stretch of eight solid minutes but they could not capitalize on it. They also picked up two stupid minors.
