## Nanticoke Library News

The City of Nanticoke Library Board met January 27th at 8 o'clock in the Port Dover Library. Present were Mr. Gordon Laidlaw, Chairman, Mrs. Margaret Payne, Secretary, Mr. Graydon Fields, Treasurer, Mrs. Frances Bergen, Mrs. Norma Savory, Mrs. Dorothy Doughty, Mr. Dan O'Dwyer, Mrs. Joyce Lindsay, Member Regional Library Board, and three librarians, Mrs. Glen Bell, Waterford, Mrs. Norma Cosley, Port Dover and Mrs. Teddy Abbott Selkirk. One member and the City representative were absent.

The first item of business was the election of officers. Mrs. Savory moved that all officers be returned, as their term had started with Regional Government on the 1st of April, 1974 and

they had not served a full year. This was carried, with the addition of Mrs. Abbott to serve as corresponding secretary.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted. The change in insurance brought out a lengthy discussion, which will be carried into the next meeting after getting more information. The financial report had been submitted by the clerk of the City. This will end the handling of the library finances by the City, as the funds are to be transferred to the Library Board, as indicated by the library act.

The meeting date of the board is to be changed from the fourth Monday to the second Monday of the month. This will facilitate

bill paying. Bills from the three libraries are to be brought to this meeting and the payment can be made within the 30 days. The next meeting will be Monday, February 10 at 8 o'clock in the Waterford Library.

The librarians gave reports of the past month. Mrs. Cosley was very happy to report that "The Leak" in the roof of the Port Dover Library has, apparently, been fixed. Mrs. Lindsay reported on the meetings she has attended. Our Regional Library System director, Mr. Vincent Needham, has had heart surgery and is now in satisfactory condition. It was agreed that we send flowers, with our wishes for a total recovery.
