The winter season is especially busy for members of the Pickpocket profession. Street and department store aisles are usually crowded, and heavy winter clothing makes people less aware of being bumped and jostled by others.

There are a number of ways to protect yourself.

Never carry more cash than you absolutely will need. Plan to pay by check wherever possible. A lost checkbook is easily replaced. Cash is not.

Men should keep their wallets in inside jacket pockets or hold on to them. Buttoned pants pockets pose no problem whatsoever for the talented thief. Cash is best carried in a front pant leg pocket however.

In crowded areas, women should hold on to purses tightly. They should never be swayed loosely by the strap. And a latch should always face inward.

One of the classic ploys used by professional pickpockets is the posting of a sign reading "Beware of Pickpockets." Unsuspecting passers-by invariably read the sign and immediately disclose the location of the wallets or other valuables reaching to check on them. The pickpocket has only to sit back and watch.

Flyers Win Two Out Of Three Games

The Hagersville Flyers won two out of three games in the past week to move within two points of first place.

They have played two more games than Dunnville and three more than Simcoe as the teams head into the home stretch. All postponed games will have to be made

up at an early date as the first round of the playoffs must be over by February 23rd.

On Sunday, Dec. 29 the Flyers travelled to Beamsville and came home with a 6-3 win in one of the cleanest games played in the league this year. Only seven penalties were called and
