Merritton Upsets Flyers

The Hagersville Flyers travelled to Merritton on Friday night and were upset by a fast skating Merritton club 4-3. Merritton stayed away from the rough stuff and just stuck to basic hockey as they came up with the win.

The teams battled through a scoreless first period as Richard Noon and Grant MacMillan turned back eight shots apiece in the close checking period. Referee Mark Beiler called six penalties in the first period with Hagersville getting four of them. Tony Yacolino put Hagersville on the scoreboard with a goal in the second period. Glen Hewson carried the puck in over the line and fed it over to Tony who finished the play easily. Randy Martin finished a three way passing play with Bob Powless and Glen Ross to give the Flyers a two goal lead.

The Centennials failed to fold under the two goal deficit and replied with two goals of their own in a two-minute span to knot

the score at 2-2 after two periods.

Hagersville picked up two penalties in the second period and Merritton sat out one. The Centennials outshot the Flyers 17-13 in this period for one of the few times that the Flyers did not have the edge early in the game.


Hagersville started out in the third period like they were going to skate Merritton out of the arena. Their spurt lasted about seven minutes when they peppered 12 shots towards MacMillan in the Merritton net. They could only come up with one goal however and that was a screened bullet by Ross McKeen. The Flyers seemed to stop skating and sit on their lead as Merritton got a goal from Paul Bonazza to make it a tie hockey game. Three minutes later a deflected

shot got by Noon and this proved to be the winner. Brent Ramsome was credited with the goal as it went in off a Hagersville stick.

The Flyers came to life late in the game in hopes of pulling it out. But McMillan was just too good in goal for the winners. He robbed Paul Fryett, Dean Webb and Greg Ross of what looked like sure goals. The save on Ross with less than two minutes left was one of the best we have ever seen.

It was recently announced that the Six Nations Reservation residents will soon be able to purchase gasoline on the reserve without paying the provincial sales tax.

Auditor D.H. Donnelly, with the ministry of revenue, told Six Nations council that residents can apply for exemption from the 19 cent a gallon tax free. Following the processing of applications received, residents will be given identification cards to use when they buy gasoline on the reserve. Mr. Donnelly said that when the resident presents his card to an authorized dealer, he won't have to pay tax on the gas. However, the service station operator must pay the oil company the regular price including the tax. He will later recover the tax from the Province of Ontario.

Several service station operators from the Six Nations said they felt it was most unfair they had to pay the oil company a price that includes the tax, when they

cannot charge it to the consumer. The Province, Mr. Donnelly said, will do everything it can to get the money back to the operator as soon as it is possible.

Section 87 of the Indian Act states that property of Indians on the reserve is exempt from taxation. Mr. Donnelly said, "The ministry now says that gasoline purchased on the reserve is property, and therefore exempt from taxation," he stated. Mr. Donnelly said the council could write to the ministry of transportation and communication and ask for a written commitment that road subsidies would not be ended. He said, many years ago, the department of highways collected the gasoline tax, but now the ministry of revenue collects all taxes, and all money goes into one large fund.


