

Flyers Score Nine Goals— Tie Dunnville Terriers

A five minute major really hurt the club as the Terriers pumped in three

goals during this stretch. Joe Jacob, Dave Farr and Mike Hedden scored for the Terriers in the first period and Dave Murphy added two more. Randy Martin, Bob Powless and Craig McKeen scored for the Flyers in the first period with McKeen's goal coming with just one second left in the period.

The Flyers came out a mile high in the second period and pumped in four goals. Randy Martin, Sandy Gibbons, Bill Winkworth and Glen Hewson scored for the Flyers before the Terriers came back with two goals by Wayne Vallee and Paul Sorge.

Dave Farr put the Dunnville team ahead early in the third period, but Tony Yacubino got this one back for the Flyers. Murphy scored his third of the night only to have Winkworth pull Hagersville into a tie again. The teams battled through the last nine minutes without scoring a goal. Both teams had a lot of chances in the last few minutes but could not get the right bounce.

while Dunnville picked up 23. Dunnville sat out 14 penalties including a match penalty for spearing. Hagersville had 11 minors and two majors; one for high sticking and one for fighting. This Sunday at 7:30 the Terriers are in Hagersville for a rematch. A game like last week's is what we need just before playoffs because it will get the fans in the spirit of the game.
