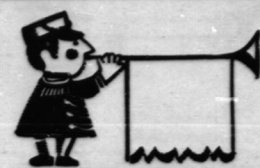


Hagersville Highlights

O.P.P. Members Receive Long Service And Good Conduct Awards

Ontario Provincial Police Commissioner, H.H. Graham officiated at a presentation of Long Service and Good Conduct awards held at Burlington, Ontario, December 11th, 1974.

The Ontario Provincial Police Long Service and Good Conduct Medal is awarded to a member of irreproachable character who has served not less than 20 years with the Force; the last 10 of which has been

with good conduct and satisfactory service.

Also present at the awards presentation were Superintendents, G.E. Code from the Burlington O.P.P. Headquarters and F.B. Lymburner from the Niagara Falls O.P.P. Headquarters. The recipients were commended by the Commissioner and the Superintendent for their dedication and service to the Force and the communities in which they served over the years.

Recipients of the Awards were:

(1) Corporal W.R. "Bill" Varden, detachment commander of the O.P.P. Norfolk detachment.

Corporal Varden was appointed to the Force on August 9, 1954. He served at Cayuga, Crystal Beach, Simcoe, Burlington and his present posting at Norfolk. Corporal Varden also served with the First Canadian Parachute Battalion in World War II. He is married with four children and resides in Langton, Ontario. His home town was Port Colborne, Ontario.

(2) Provincial Constable T.W. "Tom" Myers, O.P.P. Simcoe Detachment.

Constable Myers was appointed to the Force on August 5th, 1954 and was posted to the Simcoe detachment, where he is presently engaged as Community Services Officer for the detachment. Constable Myers is married with seven children and resides in Simcoe, Ontario. His home town was Hamilton, Ontario.

(3) Provincial Constable M. "Mike" Tarnic, O.P.P. Cayuga Detachment.

Constable Tarnic was appointed to the Force on December 6, 1954 and has served at Humberstone Township and his present posting as General Duty officer at the Cayuga detachment. Constable Tarnic is married with

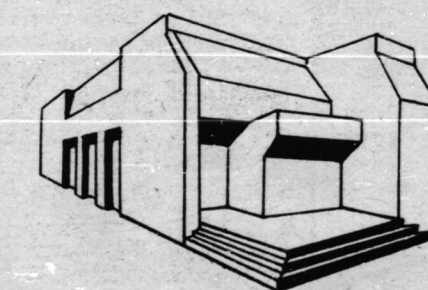
