

Library hours cut

The Town of Haldimand Public Library Board announces with regret a cut-back in the number of hours of service that its libraries will provide to the citizens of Haldimand.

Effective immediately, the Caledonia, Cayuga, and Hagersville Public Libraries will open an hour later, 2:30 p.m., on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. The libraries will also close at 2 p.m. on Saturdays. They will continue to remain open until 8 p.m. Monday to Friday, since the Board believes that the public wants the service provided in the early evening, and the children's hours from 10 a.m. until noon on Wednesdays remain unchanged. On Saturdays the libraries will be open from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m.

The cut-back in hours has been made necessary by a reduction in the budget, caused by the cut in the budget made by the Haldimand Council. The Council increased its grant from \$25,000 to \$33,000, maintaining its rate of approximately two dollars per capita. The Board had requested an increase to three dollars, to help meet the inflationary increase in the costs of books, and the increased salaries of its employees, many of whom work at the minimum wage.

The Board has also slashed its planned book purchases for the year, particularly in the area of special reference books. New records, especially those for children, have been omitted.

It is regrettable to have to close our libraries for even an hour a day, as the Board feels that the people of Haldimand need and want good library service. Our book collections are not up to accepted Canadian Library standards now, and it was the Board's hope to improve our collections gradually over the next eight to ten years and serve Haldimand better.

We will continue to provide the best service possible with the funds that are available, and hope that next year we will be able to re-open the libraries for thirty-five hours a week, and substantially improve our collections.

The Kinsmen Club of Caledonia, for the third consecutive year, has made a generous donation to the Caledonia Public Library.

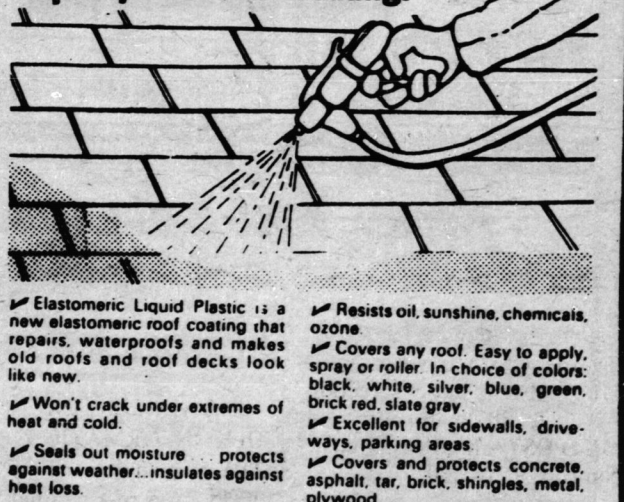
