Justice Minister Otto Lang is once again under pressure from the Canadian medical profession in their bid to amend the Criminal Code so doctors who practice euthanasia, or mercy killing, may be protected from prosecution.

A Quebec City doctor, Robert Goudreau recently said many doctors in Canada practice passive euthanasia "which they all do illegally at the present time." He added that these doctors should finally be recognized by the Criminal Code which currently classifies the practice as a crime.

The doctor also said physicians face an ethical dilemma when he must decide to use strong pain-relieving drugs to a dying patient even though the doctor knows it will shorten the patient's life.

In the eyes of the law, mercy killing is quite simply murder. This most recent issue is similar to the abortion debate which left a

Montreal doctor with a lengthy prison term for performing abortions which he thought were the right of individuals to decide upon, not the government.

Many Canadian doctors hope Mr. Lang's one-dimensional mind will bend somewhat to legally accept the current medical practices of euthanasia which are now illegal.

Mr. Lang should take note of some indications that euthanasia is increasingly becoming more acceptable by the public: The Euthanasia Society of America, which claimed 600 members in 1969, now claims more than 5,000; the American Medical Association last year, supported the practicing of euthanasia after the agreement of consent by the family of the patient; a bill was introduced in the United States recently, legally recognizing euthanasia treatment if a person has signed his will before his illness.

Another doctor describes the position on euthanasia of many doctors today. "If you ask me if I believe in euthanasia, I would say yes. If you

ask if I practice euthanasia, I would say no."

Dr. Charles Rath said, "You're influenced by your own experiences, the quality of life is very important. I've had patients who wanted to be kept alive, whose quality of life was so poor, and the impact of their disease was so great on those around them that I've felt ashamed of myself for keeping them alive."

There are limitations of protecting doctors completely from practicing euthanasia, however. Relatives of a dying patient may, for instance, be in awe of a surgeon and accept his suggestion of allowing their family member to die.

Perhaps doctors should only describe the extent of the patient's illness and how close death is. He should be devastatingly honest with the family which then takes the responsibility of deciding on keeping the patient alive or not.

Once a family has given their consent to withhold their relative, however, these doctors should be protected by law from possible prosecution by the family once

Strict standards should be established by the medical profession so that Parliament may appraise the situation as quickly as possible. Each day patients are either being allowed to die or are kept alive by a doctor who is fully

aware that death is imminent but fears criminal prosecution.

Will we see amendments to the Criminal Code be made to protect these doctors or will we witness another one man course on the ethics of life?
