Pitting nature against itself

Dr. Peter Harris of Agriculture Canada's Regina, Sask., Research Station has been studying methods of biological control of unwanted weeds.

He looks for a natural agent which, in the course of its normal activities, will destroy one particular plant. For example, he found a seed-head weevil that will develop only in the flowers of the nodding thistle. Several weevils can develop in a single thistle head and each destroy about 25 seeds.

The government will give the municipality half the subsidy after a letter of clearance is issued and they will receive the other half when building permits have been sent out. Before the clearance letter can be issued, all zone changes and plan changes must be made.

The region keeps 20 per cent of the subsidy while the area municipality gets the other 80 per cent.

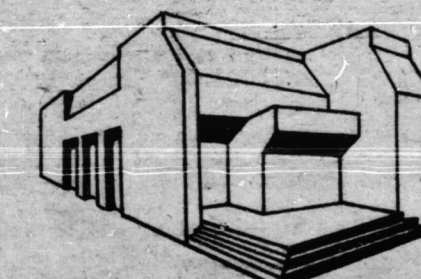
