Ontario Hydro builds tower

Ontario Hydro informed Regional Council last week that they intend to build a permanent 300 foot meteorological tower in former Walpole on Hydro lands.

The tower, which will be used mainly by Ontario Hydro to measure atmospheric conditions, will have wind direction levels at elevations of 30 feet, 100 feet and 150 feet. Temperatures will be measured at the 30 and 300 foot marks.

Hydro also plans to build a smaller, collapsible tower. Beginning in March or April, Hydro will put into use a tower which will operate on and off through April to September.

stable prices and more money for growers. Fredrick, a soft white wheat, is cornering the winter wheat market in southern Ontario where more than 400,000 acres were grown last year. Its sudden rise to popularity is expected to make it the wheat most commonly grown there in the future.

Germination tests give farmers an idea of the growth potential of their own grain used for seed, says an Agriculture Canada seed biologist.

Many seed-cleaning firms, grain pools and other companies perform these tests. Farmers may also mail samples to one of Agriculture Canada's Plant Products laboratories for testing. These are in Vancouver, Edmonton, Saskatoon, Winnipeg, Toronto and Montreal.

What happens to a herbicide after it has been sprayed on a crop and is absorbed by various plants in the field?

Dr. Allan Cessna, a chemist at Agriculture Canada's Regina, Sask., research station, is trying to find out.

"It's possible that herbicides become harmless compounds in the crop plant. But, on the other hand, they may also produce harmful break-down products," he says.

His work involves applying radioactively labelled herbicides to test plants. The herbicide is absorbed by the plant and the radioactivity can easily be pinpointed. In this way, Dr. Cessna can locate its whereabouts in the plant to discover whether the plant, through its normal functions, converts the herbicide to other compounds.
