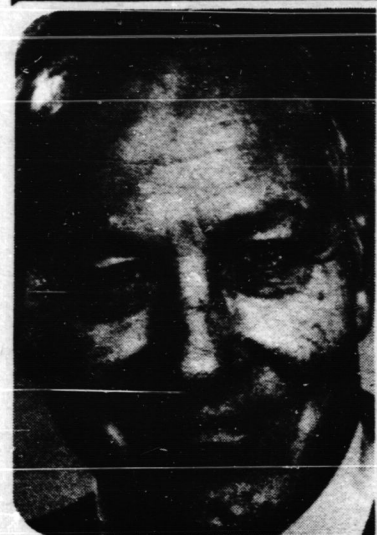
Ball Meeting Poorly Attended

Profile of a businessman

The Industrial Development Bank is a crown corporation which visits small communities across the country to explain modern business procedures to local enterprises. The IDB held a seminar in Port Dover last Wednesday for this purpose, and the seminar was chaired by local television and appliance salesman and repairman, Don Gagon.

He preaches because "my accountant would have it no other way."

"I have the finest equipped store of its type in the area," claims Mr. Gagon, and I am still teaching my customers about new

appliances." He used micro-wave ovens as an example.

"Most people had never heard of these ovens before they see them sitting in my shop." Aside from selling micro-wave ovens, Mr.

Gagon sells all types of electric and electronic equipment, from portable radios to refrigerators and ranges. He also is the sole dealer for Panasonic, one of the more prosperous and futuristic electronic firms,

and carries their complete line, including colour televisions, auto tape decks, and stereo and quad tuners and speakers.

Even though he is from a big city, he immensely enjoys the small-town

atmosphere. "I had to get out of Hamilton," he said, "and I like the relaxed pace and the congenial people in Port Dover." He presently lives in Simcoe with his wife, a registered nurse, and his ten-year-old daughter.

Mr. Gagon took the position because he feels there is a definite need for the IDB's service in the area. "Most of the businesses in the town are using 20-year-old business methods," according to Mr. Gagon, "and the IDB won't give financial assistance to these firms unless they show some progression in this area."

A former Hamilton resident, Mr. Gagon should know something about big city life. He opened his shop in Port Dover in October, 1974, and his business has been quite successful, but as he puts it, "It takes about a year before we really know where we stand."

Mr. Gagon is a former RNA who suffered a back injury and could not go back to that profession. The Workmen's Compensation Board, of which he does not speak too highly, had him take a chemistry course. "I went to Mohawk College for a year and a half, not the least bit interested in chemistry," said Mr. Gagon.

Always tinkering with electronics, he decided to make some money at his hobby. After taking a course in electronics, Mr. Gagon worked for a couple of television and appliance repair firms in Port Dover before going out on his own.

He runs his operation by himself at present, but hopes to hire another man in the near future. His well-equipped workshop includes all necessary tools and parts, including \$10,000 worth of test and diagnostic meters. Mr. Gagon is also fully qualified to install television antennae, and has a few sitting in his store room ready to be put up as soon as the weather gets better.

"Hopefully the seminar will be a success," said Mr. Gagon, who practices what

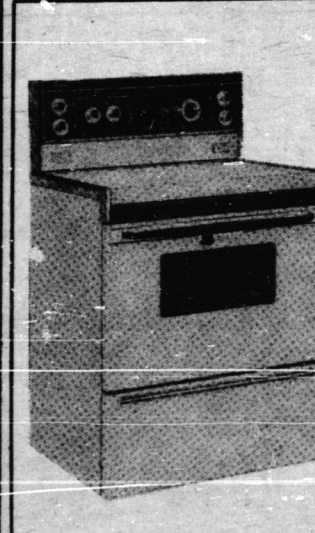

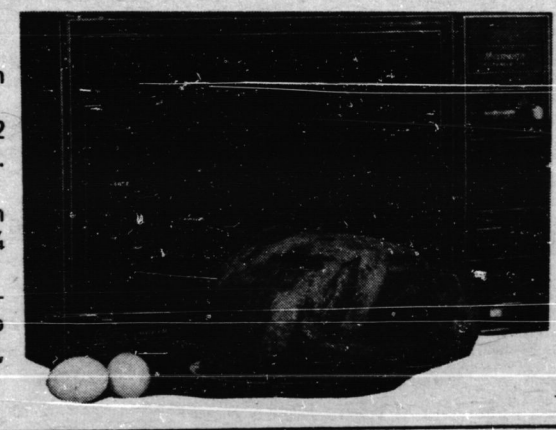
