

4-H news

The name 4-H comes from the first letters of the words Head, Heart, Hands and Health. These words symbolize mental, emotional, social and physical growth. The development of rural youth

in these four areas is the basic purpose of 4-H. The motto of the 4-H program in Canada is "Learn to do by doing". As an informal education program, 4-H helps young people, ages 12 to 20,

develop a variety of personal skills — skills related to working with other people; skills related to projects of special interest to the members; and skills related to a young person developing into a responsible citizen.

The 4-H motto applies directly to the development of these skills — it stipulates that a 4-H member learns skills by actually doing the activities related to those skills.

The opposite is learning about a skill simply by listening to someone teach the skill, or watching someone demonstrate it. This is NOT the 4-H way — in 4-H the member also gets involved in "doing".

4-H members organize into clubs in their community and meet together monthly to plan and participate in activities

of interest to them. These activities may be related to care and feeding of their livestock project or showing the skills they have learned in a competition at the local fair.

Guidance is given to these clubs by one or more adult volunteer leaders and staff of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

Our youth may or may not need agricultural training. However, you can be sure that they need the friendship, guidance and opportunities that 4-H can offer.

Last year in Haldimand alone over 200 rural young people were involved in 4-H Agricultural Clubs.



To Pay \$3 More

Engineer William McDowell explained that some of the price hike can be attributed to the fact that water and sewage systems were not properly maintained before, and that now the region must put the systems in order. Salary costs and charges levied by the ministry of environment for the operation of sewage and treatment plants, accounts for some of the other costs.

Chief administrator Dan Ciona, warned council that the province wants the region to make the water and sewage systems pay for themselves within a few years. This would require substantial rate increases over the next few years.

Dunnville residents paid \$5.94 per month, and will pay \$9.10 under the new rate. Another \$120,000 will be raised on the mill rate to help offset sewage costs. The Dunnville system will lose \$55,000 a year.

Port Dover rates will increase from \$6 to \$9, and \$32,000 will be raised on the mill rate. Their operating deficit will be \$40,000.

Simcoe residents will pay an increase of \$3 over the present \$7 rates.

Caledonia rates increase from \$2.79 to \$4.28, for water rates, with \$64,000 being raised on the mill rate to offset sewer charges. Their deficit will be \$40,000.

Cayuga's water and sewer system will be self supporting, but residents can expect increases from the present \$10.05 per month, to \$12 a month.

Port Rowan residents will pay \$1.50, \$1.05 more, over the present \$10 charge.
